A REVIEW OF THE CLUB YEAR ENDING OCTOBER 1, 1981

This edition of the "TRAIL BLAZER" brings us up-to-date on the activities and events during 1981. The Club is proud of the program it presented during the year, as it was definitely in accordance with the purpose of the Club as defined in the constitution "To encourage a love of nature, through the promotion of outdoor recreation in the form of hikes and outings, and to sponsor other activities incidental to the foregoing".

1982 will be the 25th anniversary year for the Indianapolis Hiking Club and ways to celebrate are being planned. The growth and success of the Club has been due to many factors - the two main ones being the capable and dedicated officers who have guided the Club over the years, and the active and enthusiastic involvement of so many of the members who have taken part in the activities of the Club. It is quite evident that most people who join are lovers of the out-of-doors, and thus become ardent supporters of the hikes and outings.

There is an inherent pleasure and enjoyment in hiking with good friends in the Club throughout the changing seasons of Indiana. We can relax along a shady cool forest trail during summer - enjoy the blaze of autumn color in southern Indiana - meet the challenge of "Ole Man Winter" - and watch the land spring back to life in April and May.

At the end of our year on October 1, 1981, there were 325 paid up members. The percentage who took part in the Club's program of activities was very high as you can tell from a perusal of the list of hikes and outings on some of the following pages. The Club sponsored 81 hikes, 4 overnight outings and 3 backpack weekends, plus the annual Christmas party and the summer picnic. Also there were the four quarterly General Assembly meetings at which the members were informed of the progress of the Club during the short business meeting, and were entertained by the interesting and informative programs which followed.

During the year, the Club's constitution was rewritten in line with the current practices and policies, and this revision was approved by the members at the General Assembly on March 12, 1981. The original constitution, which was written during 1957, had served the Club well, and the changes made did not alter the basic concept - but merely more clearly defined the duties of officers, and went into more detail in other areas in line with the way the Club is currently operating.

The officers who served the Club during this year are very appreciative of the support of the members for the program which they presented. The Indianapolis Hiking Club has been fortunate in having dedicated people to steer the Club, and this year's group, listed below, is certainly no exception to the rule.

Congratulations to all on the Honor Roll, and especially to Alice Brink and Linda Elliott, who made the grade during their first year in the Club.

Our year of hiking started in October with Libby Moore's backpack in Hoosier National forest. We had a couple of state parks, and we followed George Newhall through Morgan Monroe, and George MacLean at Sahn park. And we ended up with Tom Patterson leading a group on a race down the Tulip Tree Trace.

In November we explored a couple more state forests, visited the Children's Museum with Joe Wilhelm, saw the Indian Mounds, followed Ed Chambers to a Lazy Lake, and finished up with Marsha Hutchins on a three day backpack and day hikes on the Adventure Trail, and with Win Pulsifer at Garfield Park.

The four overnight outings during the year were outstanding successes and much of the credit goes to the program director, Hazel Morrison, and her staff of "Volunteers" who so ably pitched in and helped whenever needed.

#### CAMP RILEY IN BRADFORD WOODS IN OCTOBER

A group of about 50 people spent a weekend amid the beautiful surroundings of Camp Riley in Bradford Woods. Such a gorgeous time of the year to be in the woods. Good hiking around the lake, and Bob Begeman led some on a longer hike to the Al White Trail. The food in the
