Ten people, who had been hiking together, met in January of 1957 to form a hiking club. Little did they know how successful the club would become. The Indianapolis Hiking Club celebrated 25 years during 1982, and the main event was the Silver Anniversary Banquet at the Lake Shore Country Club on April 17, 1982.

This edition of the TRAIL BLAZER covers the activities and events during 1982. Most people who join the club are lovers of the out-of-doors, and thus a large percentage of members support the programs presented by the club. You can easily verify this by reading the list of hikes and outings, and the mileage reports on some of the following pages.

At the end of year on October 1, 1982, there were 362 paid up members. The club sponsored 100 hikes (one cancelled by snow), 4 overnight outings, two weekend backpacks, a one week backpack, a two week backpack, a canoe trip for a week, plus the Christmas party, and the summer picnic. There were also the General Assembly meetings which are business meetings at which members of the club receive progress reports, and learn more about the workings of the club. At these general assembly meetings there is always an interesting program following the business meeting.

The 1982 officers of the Indianapolis Hiking Club desire to express their appreciation for the support and help from the members. This involvement of so many has contributed to the growth of the club.

The big event of the year was the 25th Anniversary Banquet on April 17th. 130 members and guests enjoyed the evening at the Lake Shore Country Club, which had been transformed by the decorating committee. It was in a happy frame of mind that we reminisced, and it certainly brought back memories to many as they perused the clippings and pictures which had been assembled from the scrapbooks and albums of many members. The dinner music by the Paul Burton trio set the mood for relaxing throughout the evening. Frank Thompson, the president, and Bill Larrison, the master of ceremonies, conducted the after dinner program. Many of previous officers were called on for remarks and comments. Fred Lorenz, our guest speaker, told us about some of the history of his Gnaw Bone Camp, and the relationship with the club. It was great to recognize the charter members who were present. Many people spent long hours preparing for the 25 year celebration at Lake Shore, and they all deserve a round of applause.

Our year of hiking started with a bang on October 3rd and 4th with three events; the Thompsons took us to the Lincoln Park & Memorial, Fred Eckstein helped us explore Spring Hill, and Libby Moore went backpacking with a group in Hoosier National Forest. John Behrmann and Charles Brunette then took us on a couple of Indian trails near Fort Wayne. And back to Eagle Creek with Libby, and a Fort Harrison Volksmarch with Bob McConnell. We took in Morgan-Monroe a couple of times with Ed and Peggy and with George Newhall. We saw Woodruff Place and Zionsville, and followed Cliff on the Covered Bridge trail.

November was a busy month, starting with a climb up the Knobstone with Pat Fox, and Clark State forest with Bill & Peggy. Followed John Behrmann on Part II of Laughery Creek, and went with Bill Larrison to Muscatatuck, and followed Hank on the canal. Saw some golf courses with Libby, and back to the Knobstone back country with Pat. Cliff took over for Mary Kidwell on the Overlook, and Norm Herin took us to Nebo Ridge. And then to Purdue with Paul Anuta.

During the year, the club sponsored four overnight or weekend outings at various parks and camps. These are special events in the club's list of activities. Listed below are comments and remarks about each of these affairs.

The Waycross Episcopal Camp, situated in the rolling hills and valleys of northeast Brown County, was the scene of the fall overnight. 45 people enjoyed the autumn scenery as we hiked through the countryside and over to Camp Gallahue. WINTER AT HUESTON WOODS

was a good mixer for the group, and after the meal in the Fireside Room, a park naturalist, Patty Kozusko, presented a program entitled "ANIMAL TALK" - with some interesting wild nizens of the area. After the morning hike on Sunday, and the noon meal, everybody felt that the weekend had been perfect.

MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND AT GNAW BONE CAMP

The Lorenzes welcomed the 99 members, guests, children, and several day hikers to the 12th annual Memorial Day weekend at their forested valley retreat in the hills of Brown County just outside of Nashville.
