Sunday, October 5 -- Happy Hollow Camp

Meet at 10:00 A.M., east side of State House, Market and Capitol, and proceed via Road 135 to Nashville. From there take 135 south to Stone Head, turn left and follow road to Happy Hollow Camp (approximately 65 miles from Indianapolis). This camp, operated by the settlement houses of Indianapolis, contains about 700 acres of interesting, rugged terrain, as well as a large lake. Bring food for noon lunch and evening cook-out. This is new country for us, which we are able to visit through special permission. Leader: Bob Murray, ME 8-8615.

Sunday, October 12 -- Geist Reservoir Area

Meet at 1:00 P.M., east side of State House, Market and Capitol, and proceed to Geist Reservoir, where we will reassemble at the boat house parking lot at 2:00 P.M. Although we have visited the area several times in the past, the present hike will be in an area that we have not yet investigated. We will return to Indianapolis in time for dinner. Sunday, October 19 -- Crosley State Fish and Game Area, Vernon, Indiana

Meet at 10:00 A.M. east side of State House, Market and Capitol, and proceed via Routes 31 and 7 to Vernon (66 miles), where we will meet at the north side of the Court House. From there we will proceed to the Crosley area. (Special instructions are necessary, so call leader if you will be unable to go with group) Bring food for a cold lunch and an evening cook-out. The Crosley area is the recently purchased estate of Powell Crosley, Jr. and consists of 3100 acres of beautiful terrain. It contains an old mill, a 15 acre private lake and beautiful woods. The purchase is written up in OUTDOOR INDIANA for April 1958. It is a real pleasure to secure permission to visit the area. Leader: Mary Hufferd, FL 7-1076 (evenings)

Saturday, October 25 -- Week End, McCormick's Creek State Park

Meet at 2:00 P.M. Saturday at trolley turn-around, Pleasant Run and South Meridian. Take Route 67 to Spencer (55 miles) and proceed to park. Bring necessary outdoor camping equipment, blankets and food and supplies for three meals. For those preferring indoor facilities, the housekeeping cabins at the park will be available, but it will be necessary to furnish blankets, linen, dishes and silver. These cabins are comfortable, containing four to six beds, with kitchenette (electric stoves and refrigerators) and toilet facilities. The fee for the cabins will be One Dollar per person. Since the number we can accommodate is limited, it will be necessary to call Bill Murphy, ME 8-8615, for reservations. A Dollar deposit for each reservation will be necessary.

Sunday, October 26 -- McCormick's Creek State Park

Meet at 10:00 A.M., east side of State House, Market and Capitol, and proceed via Road 67 to Spencer (55 miles) and from there to the park. Inquire of gateman location of cabins. Meet over-night group there at 12:00 Noon for cook-out. There will be a lengthy hike during the afternoon, as well as opportunity for horseback riding. Bring food for two meals.
