June 7th - Brown County State Park

Meet at 10 AM at State House, east side, corner of Capitol and Market Streets. Proceed to Nashville via Road 135 and meet again at the Courthouse at 11.30 AM. June 14th - Cordry Lake (For members and invited guests only)

Meet at 1 PM at State House, east side, corner of Capitol and Market Streets. Take Road 31 to Road 252 (south of Franklin). Proceed west about seven miles, then turn south on county road to Ninevah. Drive through Ninevah, south past Prince's Lakes to Cordry Lake. Enter drive and follow Route 1 to 11th Drive, and proceed to the foot of the Drive. We will be guests of the Hesoun Family. June 21st - Crosley State Fish and Game Area, Vernon, Indiana

Meet at 10 AM, east side of State House, Market and Capitol, and proceed via Routes 31 and 7 to Vernon (66 miles), where we will meet at the north side of the Court House. Bring food and drink for two cold meals, in view of the uncertainty of fire hazard conditions. The Crosley Area was purchased last spring, and was the former estate of Powell Crosley, Jr. It consists of 3100 acres of beautiful terrain, an old mill, a 15 acre private lake and woods.
