August 2nd - Morgan-Monroe State Forest

Meet at 10:00 A.M., east side of State House, Capitol and Market Streets. Take Road 37 to Martinsville, meeting at the Court House at 11:15, and proceeding from there to the State Forest (old No. 37 between Martinsville and Bloomington). August 16th - Morse Reservoir and Forest Park in Noblesville
