Sunday, October 8 -- Woolens Gardens

This is a repeat of a popular hike with a new starting point. Meet at east side of the State House at 1:30 P.M. Proceed to All Souls Unitarian Church, 5801 East 56th Street, meeting in their parking lot at 2:15 P.M. Leader: Charles Baldwin, LI 6-9581.

Sunday, October 15 -- Prairie Valley Scout Camp Kikthawenund

Meet at east side of State House at 1:00 P.M. Proceed on 37A through Noblesville to one mile north of junction with route 13, and turn east to camp. Sunday, October 22 -- Briarwood Hike (New)

Meet at east side of State House at 1:00 P.M. Reassemble at Post Office in Monrovia at 2:00 P.M. (Road 67 to Mooresville, right on Road 42 to Monrovia). The hike will be mostly along country roads, the distance being 4 to 8 miles depending on the wishes of the hikers. Bring food for an old fashion cook-out. Leader: Hugh McCracken. Sunday, October 29 -- Timberlane Farm, Lebanon

Meet at State House at 1:00 P.M. Proceed on Road 421 to first road north of junct on with Road 47. Turn left toward Mechanicsburg. Roy Reid's Timberlane Farm is second on north side of road. Sunday, November 5 -- TULIP TREE TRACE (Third Annual 22 Miler)

Since the Tulip Tree Trace covers a distance of 22 miles, it is essential that we get an early start, allowing eight to nine hours hiking time for those with the stamina to complete the entire hike. Therefore, we are requesting everyone to be at the east side of the State House at 7:00 A.M. promptly. We shall proceed to Morgan-Monroe State Forest, which is the starting point of the Trace.

The Tulip Tree Trace is a 22 mile hike extending from Morgan-Monroe State Forest to the Yellowwood Lake. Eighteen miles of the trail are cross country through dense forest and about four of the middle miles of the Trace are covered by road. The path and the roads follow a combination of old Indiana, pioneer and stagecoach trails that were used before and during the development of this part of Indiana.

For those members who feel that they cannot make the entire hike, there will be transportation available at various points along the trail. The hikers who complete the entire 22 miles will be awarded a special certificate at our next business meeting.

If there are any members who feel that they cannot get away this early in the morning, we are making plans for this group to start the trail at its midway point, meeting at 12:00 noon at Trevlac, on Road 45. Any hikers who fall in this category should contact Steve O'Connor, LI 7-9752, so that we can make arrangements for transportation.

All hikers should bring along a light noon lunch (no time for cook-out here). Hot coffee and water jugs will be available at various points along the trail; however, you should carry your own canteen on the trail. Wear heavy wool socks and hiking shoes with good arch supports. Also a good heavy jacket might feel good during the rest periods and at the end of the hike. Everyone will receive a map of the trail, so we do not expect to have many lost souls.

Sunday, November 5 -- 3rd ANNUAL LONG HIKE (Tulip Tree Trace)

Meet promptly at 7:00 A.M. at the east side of the State House so that we can get an early start from Morgan-Monroe State Forest. The 22 miles will require in excess of 7 hours hiking time. Bring your own food for the day (no cook-outs) and perhaps a canteen of water for the trails. Coffee and water will be supplied at stopping points along the road. Wear heavy wool socks and comfortable shoes. Dress to suit the weather conditions. Those not able to walk the entire distance may join the group at Trevlac on State Road #45 at 12:00 o'clock noon and walk the latter part of the trail.
