Sunday, April 1 - T.C. Steele State Memorial

Meet at 10:00 A.M. east side of State House, or at Court House at Nashville (via Rd. 135) at 11:30 A.M. We will proceed from there to Belmont, and the T.C. Steele State Memorial. T.C. Steele was one of Indiana's outstanding artists, and there will be an opportunity to visit his studios (admission - 25¢), as well as hike the area he painted. After a cold lunch, we will hike the vicinity in both slow and rugged hiking groups. There will be an evening cookout. This is an opportunity to view an interesting memorial amid beautiful scenery. Sunday, April 8 - Prairie Valley Scout Camp Kikthawenund
