Sunday, Oct. 7 - Squirrel Timber Hike (New Area)

Meet at 1: P.M. at east side of State House, and re-assemble at 1:45 P.M. at the Wild Cherry Inn on Highway 67, south of Mooresville (The Wild Cherry Inn is about 2 miles north of Martinsville on 67).
