Sunday - April 7 - Woods along Fall Creek in Fort Harrison - New Area

Meet at 1:30 p.m. at east side of State House and again at 2:15 p.m. at bridge by Fall Creek Parkway at 63rd Street (Boy Scout Road ends here). We have permission to hike in this 114 acre tract on Fort Harrison along Fall Creek. 1,245 trees of 12 varieties will soon be cut from this area. This will be a rugged hike through timber. Sunday - April 14 - Pogues Run through Brookside and Spades Parks - Easy Hike.

Sunday - April 21 - Northwest Brown County - Exploratory Hike (By map and compass)

Meet at 10:00 a.m. at the east side of the State House and again at 11:00 a.m. in Morgantown at the railroad tracks and highway #135. We will proceed from there in a group to Beech Grove Church in Brown County, where the hike will begin. Bring food for lunch on the trail (No cook-out). Turn left and drive 1.5 miles straight east. Turn right into farm lane that winds up the hill - 1/4 mile to Brick farm house.
