Sunday - August 4 - Shady Hike

Meet at 10:00 at east side of the State House and again at 12:00 at the home of Ernest Haviland. Take highway #28 west from U.S. #52 for approx. 28 mi. and turn right (north) on a blacktop road (this road is just 1 mile west of junction with Ind. #341 Go north three miles, cross Wabash River and turn right at intersection in the town of Independence. Follow this River Road two miles and turn left (north), after 2½ mi. turn right when this road ends with a "T" and go east about a mile, cross High Bridge and turn right at first lane (Haviland Property). Sunday - September 22 - Pine Hill Wilderness Area - New Hike - Rugged.

Meet at 10:00 a.m. at east side of the State House and again at 11:30 a.m., at the intersection of highways #234 and #47 (about 4 miles east of Shades St. Park.)
