Sunday - October 6 - Doughty Farm Hike and Cook-out - Moderate Hike through woods.

Meet at 1:00 p.m. at east side of State House and again at the farm of Mr. & Mrs. Paul Doughty south of Carthage. Turn south from Highway #40 at Charlottesville (about 10 miles east of Greenfield) at the Carthage sign and arrow. Drive south about 4.4 miles to the Walnut Friends Church and cemetery. Turn left and drive 2.5 miles straight east (correct mileage this time.) Turn right into farm lane that winds up the hill to brick farm house ($\frac{1}{4}$ mile.) Bring food for an evening cook-out of the old-fashioned variety. This hike we took on April 28th and is being repeated by popular request. Leader: Martha Rogers - Wa 5-2670.

**Saturday and Sunday - October 12-13 - Fall Week-end at Shakamak State Park.

A gala week-end with Indiana in full color has been planned for this first trip of the Indianapolis Hiking Club to Shakamak State Park. Sunday - October 20 - Bradford Woods Hike - Moderate or Strenuous.

Meet at 1:00 p.m. east side of State House, and again at 2:30 p.m. at the Woods. Proceed via Rd 67 to Bradford Woods (NOT Camp Bradford) between Brooklyn and Martinsville cut-off (about 30 miles.) Turn right and park in grounds. Bring food for evening cook-out. Scenic Bradford Woods is one of our most popular hiking areas - there is much to be explored. Leaders: John & Joan Finny. Sunday - October 27 - Marott Park (a wooded city park in natural state.) Moderate.

Meet at 2:00 p.m. at Broad Ripple Municipal Parking Area (over canal between College Ave. and Guilford Ave.) This park is an undeveloped city park north of Broad Ripple with Williams Creek running through it. Sunday - November 3 - Fifth Annual 22 Mile Hike - Yellowwood Trail.

Meet at 7:00 a.m. (Promptly) at east side of State House, and proceed to Morgan-Monroe State Forest (Superintendent's Office, 4 mi. inside forest) via Rd 37, approx. 10 miles south of Martinsville. The Yellowwood Trail extends from this point to Bear Wallow on TePee Mountain. Only about a mile of this trail is along a traveled road - the rest meanders over scenic ridges and through picturesque valleys with landscape varying from open country to dense forests. For those who want to take a portion of the hike, there is a choice of either morning or afternoon. Those who plan to join for the afternoon hike should meet us at the Timberly-Beebe house 1.2 miles south of Helmsburg at 1:00 p.m. Take Rd 45 west from Bean Blossom about 2.5 miles to Helmsburg and turn left (south) on black top road. Go south 1.2 miles, part way up the hill, taking right fork in road. The Timberly-Beebe house is across the road from the Underwood Stables. All hikers should bring a light noon lunch. Hot drinks will be served at the lunch stop (Timberly-Beebe house.) Hikers may wish to carry canteens as there is no water on the trail. Be sure your shoes are sturdy and well broken-in. Visitors are invited. Try your endurance on this scenic trail. Transportation will be provided back to the cars. For further information call the leader: Bill Dentel - CL 3-0336.

Sunday, November 10 - Ladywood School Grounds & North Bank of Fall Creek (Easy)

Meet at 1:30 p.m. on east side of State House & again at 2:00 where old Millersville Rd. bridge spanned Fall Creek (Fall Creek Pkwy. south of Emerson Way.) Park cars on this segment of old road just off the Pkwy. We will hike thru the school grounds, which are well kept & beautiful; see the new Auditorium and other buildings from the outside; and admire the scenic landscape. Sunday, November 17 - Fork Creek Farms, Decatur County - New.

Meet at east side of State House at 10:00 a.m. Take rd. 421 into Greensburg to junction with Rd. 46 (Water Tower) Turn right & go to first rd. beyond Boone's Heat. & Air Condition, Plant, turn left at sign "City Park, etc.", cross railroad and the park will then be visible. Will eat cold lunch here, then proceed to Wendell Stapp farm. Two creeks fork on this 450 acre farm, which is in one of the most scenic counties in the state. The owners have opened their home to City Families during summer months for Farm Vacation fun. They will permit us to hike their farm & serve us a Roast Beef Plate dinner in the evening @ \$1.50 for adults & .75 for children under 12. Deadline for reservations & payment is Nov. 9.
