## Sunday, April 5 - Geist Reservoir - Moderate

Make "hiking" your spring tonic! Meet on the east side of the State House at one o'clock, or in the parking lot of the County Line Boat-house at Geist Reservoir at 1:45 p.m. For those of you who did not come out during the winter months, you need this hike to limber up for the rugged terrain to be encountered the two following Sundays. ## Sunday, April 12 - Camp Bradford - Rugged

Leave east side of the State House at one o'clock. Take Road 67 to intersection with Road 39 and follow signs to the camp, arriving there at two o'clock. Please note location is CAMP Bradford, not Bradford Woods. This is the hike to get the kinks out of your system (approximately 5 miles long). ## Sunday, April 19 - Ten O'Clock Line - Very Rugged

Meet at the east side of the State House at 10 a.m. Take Road 135 to intersection with Road 46 at Nashville, turn right and go about 8 miles, turn right again at Yellowwood State Forest sign. Trail starts in the forest across from the South Camping Area. Reassemble here at 11:15. Bring a cold lunch for noon and also food for an evening cookout. 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Sun., May 3 - Brown County Hike & Visit to Broom Factory - Semi-rugged - Now

Leave east side of State House at 1 o'clock and take Rd. 135 south to junction with Rd. 45 in Bean Blossom. Turn right on Rd. 45 and continue to Trevlac, reassembling here at 2:15 between the highway and the R. R. tracks. From here we will drive to Bear Creek Lake, where Mr. Robert Richards will join us, and act as our guide over old logging roads in the back woods area. Bring light lunch & drinking water. Hiking area is heavily wooded, scenic, semi-rugged to rugged in spots. After the hike those who would like Smorgasbord at Countryside Inn, (adults \$2.00, children \$1.25) send reservations and check or money order, made payable to The Indianapolis Hiking Club, to Leta Schneider, 933 $\frac{1}{2}$  Tecumseh St., zip code 46201, by May 25. Leta will lead the way to the Inn via two covered bridges. Those not dining at the Inn, but wishing to see the bridges can also follow her and continue to Indianapolis when they reach Rd. 36.
