Sun., Aug. 2 - Tow Path

Every year since the Club's inception at least one hike along the Tow Path has been scheduled. So, let's hike it again this year as it is popular and an easy trail for a hot August afternoon. Those not having transportation should take a N. Meridian-Butler bus to the Butler Campus, or call a club member to arrange for a ride.

Assemble at Holcomb Gardens at 2:30. We will hike to the 38th Street Bridge and take a circuitous route back to Butler, where those desiring to do so can stop at the Student Union Building for refreshments. Leader: Jane Hunt Davis

Sun., Aug. 9 - Morgan-Monroe State Forest - Central Picnic Area

Leave east side of State House at 1:30 and take Rd. 37 south through Martinsville and continue to the Forest sign, turn left and drive about two miles to the entrance. Go approximately $5\frac{1}{4}$ miles into forest, pass the Superintendent's office and you will very shortly see the sign to the Central Picnic Area on the right. Drive to the location of the tables -- we will endeavor to get together at the shelter house. The hike will be along a fire trail. We expect it to be an easy hike. Charles Hynes will be the leader.

Sun. Aug. 16 - Reunion Hike IV at Garfield Park - Easy

If you do not have transportation, you can take a bus to the Park, or call someone for a ride. Meet at Garfield Park at the Band Shell at 3:00 o'clock. It is reunion time again! We would like to see all former members of the Club, as well as all current members at this outing. The hike will be easy, thru the Park, down the Parkway to Manual Training High School and return. This will be primarily a road hike where there is very little traffic and no dust. If permission can be obtained, there will be some hiking on private property. We will have a cold lunch here, then hike along White River, through Camp Redwing and over to the Reservoir. Time permitting, we can hike the campus of Ball State Teacher's College. Sun., Sept. 20 - Historical Site and Hike in the Lafayette Area

Leave east side of the State House at 10:00 a.m. Take Road 52 and inter-state 65 north to Lafayette, and follow the Business Route, which is Main Street, to Columbian Park. Assemble here around noon as near the entrance as possible so we will have no difficulty locating the hikers. This is a beautiful park and it contains one of the largest zoos in Indiana. We will have a cold lunch here, hike around the park, visit the zoo, and then be on our way. Take Route 43 north seven mi. to Route 225 and turn right for Tippecanoe Battlefield State Memorial. We will hike through Camp Battleground, which is adjacent to the Memorial. This is a Methodist Church Camp and several groups are meeting here today, so please keep a reasonable distance from the buildings so as not to disturb them. If time permits on our return through Lafayette we can visit either the Art Gallery or the Historical Museum. We have found The Country Kitchen restaurant between Lafayette and Indianapolis a good place to eat. Leader: Martha Rogers - Wa 5-2670

Leave State House at 10:00 a.m. and bring along a cold lunch. Take Inter-state 74 east to Newpoint Exit, turn left (north) on Blacktop #800. Proceed north about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles to Road #50 N, turn left (west) and continue one mile to destination, which is 700E and 50N. Enter west gate. Don't miss this hike as all of Dorothy DeArmond's hikes are interesting and well planned. For those wishing to eat before returning home, Dorothy will direct us to a restaurant near Greensburg where the food is good and moderately priced. This is the last hike of the year in competition for the apples.
