- June 6 -- Riley Tomb
Meet at 3:00 P. M. at West 38th Street and Clarendon Road (Crown Hill Mausoleum) for a short, easy hike in this area. Leader -- Don Stevens, LI 7-8015
- June 13 -- Raccoon Lake State Recreation Area
Meet at the east side of the State House at 9:30 A. M. and at 11:00 A. M. inside the park at Raccoon Lake State Recreation Area. The park entrance is about 46 miles west on Hiway 36. There is plenty of good hiking in this area, short or long, depending on the wishes of the hikers. There is a good beach, fishing, and boating available. Leader -- L. Ramborger, FL 9-0855
- June 20 -- Repeat of Margaret Veale hike in Brown County
This hike will be short or long, depending on the weather and individual preferences. Leave west side of the State House at 1:00 P. M. Follow 135 to Morgantown, turn south to the drug store (south on 135), go to the end of the street, leave 135 at this point. At the end of the street, turn right and follow the black top road 2 miles and go straight on to the gravel road 2 miles to Beech Grove Church. Park here. Leader -- Margaret Veale, ME 2-7188
- June 27 -- Honeywell Gardens at Wabash and Salamonie River State Forest
Leave east side of State House at 10:00 A. M. Take your choise of routes to Wabash (you can probably make the best time on U. S. 31 to Peru, then U. S. 24 to Wabash). Whichever road you take, turn left on Rd. 15 in downtown Wabash and drive 2 miles to Niccum Rd. (Hoffman's nursery and golf course on west side of Rd. 15), then west on Niccum to the Gardens. Bring a cold lunch for picnic on the grounds just north of parking area. Reassemble here at 12:00 M. The area open to the public comprises just under 25 acres; 9 of these are formal gardens and lawn and the remaining acreage is in its wild state. Bring your cameras! There is no admission fee. It takes about an hour for the tour. Return to Wabash, turn left when you reach Rd 24 and continue to Lagro, turning right when you see the Salamonie sign. Drive to parking area. There is a large picnic area with grills, but wood supply was practically nil, so we will probably have to forage for wood. Bring food for a cookout and plenty of drinking water. There is something for everyone; those wishing a long hike, a short hike, or no hike. Leader, Weldon O'Brien, CH 1-0745

July 4 -- Garfield Park. (Note that this is a change from the June bulletin)

July 11 - Cataract Falls

Meet at 10:00 A. M. at the east side of the State House and proceed via Hiway 40 west to Hiway 43 and go south. Watch for the Cataract sign about 2 1/2 miles south of Cloverdale and turn right.
