April 3, Eagle Creek Reservoir. New hike. Meet at the Statehouse at 1:30 and again at 38th and Dandy Trail Road. This point is a short distance west of the I-165 exit at 38th Street, approximately 7500 west. We will hike in the area of the dam construction. This is a moderate hike.

No particular time to vacate. There will be a swimming pool, a hike, fishing, covered patio. Plenty of room. Children's prices for those under twelve. Bring your own pillows and blankets.
