Oct 2 LAKE SANTEE - Greensburg

Leave State House promptly at 11 a.m. Go out Southeastern and take I-74 to State Road 3 north of Greensburg; continue north on SR 3 approximately 1 mile to intersection where a school is under construction; turn right and continue 10 miles to a 4-way stop (with Lecher Bros. sign). Go left on winding road to a T intersection with Santee sign indicating 1 mile right to entrance. Guard will permit you to park in the restaurant parking lot where we will reassemble at 12:15. You may dine here before the 1:00 p.m. hike. It is 8 Miles around lake and some will walk it, but others may want a shorter distance and go part way. Leader: James Dean

Oct 9 RACoon LAKE STATE RECREATION AREA

Leave State House 1:00 p.m. Take Road 36 approx 45 miles to entrance. Assemble at boat ramp inside park at 2:15. The foliage should be quite colorful at this time of year. Without summer's heat, hiking any of the 5 trails should be most enjoyable. CAMPERS: this is a good chance to camp Saturday. Nearby Rockville is having its Fall Festival, including re-created pioneer activities, pressing cider, boiling apple butter, making soap, etc. Enjoy this or take the Parke County Covered Bridge tour of 38 bridges and see autumn's spectacular panorama in color.

Oct 30 LADYWOOD SCHOOL GROUNDS & NORTH BANK OF FALL CREEK

Leave State House at 1:30 P.M. & meet where old Millersville Rd. bridge spanned Fall Creek (Fall Creek Pkwy. South of Emerson Way). Park cars on this segment of old road just off the Pkwy. After a hike through the scenic & well kept school grounds, we will continue along Fall Creek for a brisk walk of more mileage. Leader: Ada Weir

Nov 6 ANNUAL LONG HIKE! TEN O'CLOCK LINE - CALLING ALL RUGGED HIKERS!.

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NOV. 6 - TEN O'CLOCK HIKE - 16 MILES, RUGGED

Leave State House at 7:30 a.m. Go State Road 135 to Nashville. Take State Road 46 West. Pass west entrance of Brown Co. State Park. Continue on State Road 46 to Yellowwood Lake entrance. Turn right into entrance and continue on to iron bridge and large sign. Turn left, continue on widest road to Scout Camping Area. Hike must start at 9:00 a.m. Lunch at mid-point (Hickory Cemetery) Leader - Lee Ramborger

SECOND HALF OF TRAIL ONLY

Leave State House at 10:30 a.m. Take 135 to Nashville and State Road 46, West. Go past Brown County State Park. Pass gas station at the bottom of hill. Wagon wheel back of mail box - next road. Diamond 10 marked on post. Turn right and continue one half mile to old cemetery. Meet first group and continue to end of trail. Leader - Ron Spencer

NOV. 13 - POTTERS PIKE HIKE

Meet at 2:00 p.m. at State House. Go to 38th St., turn West. Continue to end of 38th St. and turn right on Dandy Trail, continue to 56th St. Turn West - go to first road West, turn right. Park near cemetery. Leader - Martha Rogers

NOV 20 - HOLCOMB OBSERVATORY

No cars to be at State House. Buses may be obtained directly to Holcomb Garden (Butler University). Meet at Holcomb Gardens at 1:30 p.m. so that hike will be finished in time for show at observatory. Leader - Vic Knarr

Meet at State House at 2:00 p.m. - go to 64th Street on Meridian. Turn left (West). Short distance to the park entrance. Meet at Holiday House. Leader - Fran Pier
