- JUNE 7 LINK OBSERVATORY - Leave the east side of the state house at 2:00 P.M. Take SR 67 south to Mooresville, and continue south past Kelly's restaurant approximately 2.8 miles and turn right at the 3rd road on the right hand side. This is a blacktop road winding up a steep hill. Continue about 1-1/4 miles to the parking lot of the Link Observatory. After viewing the grounds of the observatory there will be a 3 to 4 mile hike beginning at 2:45 P.M. Leader Joe Wilhelm 241-8824
- JUNE 14 CROWN HILL CEMETARY - Meet at the cemetary entrance at 34th and Boulevard Place (6 blocks west of Meridian St.) for a 3 to 4 mile hike through the beautiful trees and to the top of Crown Hill - the highest point in Marion County. The hike will begin at 2:30 P.M. Leader Tom Rife 636-7083
- JUNE 21 BROWNING MOUNTAIN - This trail is through a remote part of the Hoosier National Forest - 10% unimproved county roads and 90% forest trail (provided leader unlocks his compass.) Mostly high country but some creeks to ford. Bring trail lunch and water. Optional equipment; a homing device and a loud voice. Leave the east side of the Statehouse at 8:30 A.M. Take SR 135 south to Story (15 miles south of Nashville). Assemble at the General Store at 10:30 A.M. to consolidate in cars for a short drive to the trail head. This will be 12 to 15 miles. Take SR 37 northeast to Castleton. Turn west on Road 100, then north on Masters Road. Continue on Masters Road for about one mile. Turn west on 91st street for 1/2 miles and then south into the park. 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- JUNE 28 ANNUAL HIKING CLUB PICNIC - (For members and their invited guests only)
Please refer to JUNE Bulletin for details. There is a correction on the directions to Northeastway Park. Masters Road is closed north of Road 100. Instead take the Allisonville Road (old 37) north of road 100 to 91st street, then east to the park entrance.
- JULY 5 EAGLE CREEK RESERVOIR - Leave the east side of the State House at 2:00 P.M. and proceed north to Kessler Blvd. Go west on Kessler until it becomes 56th street. Continue west on 56th street to the reservoir. Cross the causeway and take the 2nd road north (County Line Road). Go north to 65th street. Go east on 65th street until the road ends at the reservoir. Go south about 1/4 mile and park along the side of the road. 2 to 4 mile hike along the northwest side of the reservoir to start at 3:00 P.M. Leader - Ed Lavagnino 291-4495
- JULY 12 WEED PATCH HILL - Leave the east side of the State House at 8:00 A.M. and take S.R. 135 to Brown County State Park. Meet at the Fire Tower in the Park at 9:30 A.M. for about 16 miles of rugged hiking. Bring a trail lunch and water. Leader - Dr. Ray De Falque 291-8059 Asst Leader - Tom Hill 784-2784
- JULY 19 WATERFALL HIKE ALONG FALL CREEK IN THE COOL OF THE EVENING - Leave the east side of the State House at 6:15 P.M. Drive north to 46th street. Turn right and go to Allisonville Road. Turn left and drive north on Allisonville Road to 56th street. Turn right and drive about one block on 56th street then turn right into Chateau de Ville Apts. (The Apartments are not seen on 56th street.) Park at swimming pool on Rue de Ville. Meet at the Chatalet behind the swimming pool at 6:45 P.M. There will be an easy 4 to 5 mile hike. Leaders Ruth Drach 251-8606 and Jane Ford 255-2854. Following the hike, we'll have an old-fashioned ice-cream social. The Hiking Club will furnish the cake, and ice-cream will be available for each person to purchase.
- JULY 26 SHAWNEE PARK - 4 miles of moderate hiking in a private park, which just opened this spring. Leave the east side of the State House at 1:30 P.M. Take U.S. 52 southeast to the town of Andersonville (about 12 miles southeast of Rushville). Continue approximately one mile beyond Andersonville and turn right just beyond the Beechgrove trailer and service station. Proceed 1/4 mile to the entrance to the park. Assemble near the office (Red Barn) at 3:00 P.M. After the hike a room has been reserved at the famous Durbin Hotel in Rushville for the Sunday Smorgasbord. Notify the leader if you plan to attend. For those interested in camping on Saturday night at Shawnee Park, wooded camping areas are available for a modest charge (\$2.50 per camp site.) Leader John O'Drain 356-5750
- AUG 2 YELLOWWOOD LAKE - Leave the east side of the State House at 9:00 A.M. and take S.R. 135 south to Nashville and then go west on S.R. 46 about 6 miles to the road leading to Yellowwood State Forest. Turn right at the State Forest sign and follow winding road approximately 3 miles to the Boy Scout camp parking area at the north end of the Lake.
