- AUG 9 TOW PATH HIKE - Leave the east side of the State House at 1:00 P.M. Proceed north on College Avenue to Broadripple avenue. Turn right and go to Guilford Avenue. Turn left and go two blocks until just before the bridge over the canal. Turn left and park in the Broadripple Municipal parking lot. Hike will start from here at 1:45 P.M. 3 to 4 miles of easy hiking. Leader - Carl Cornell 243-3637
- AUG 16 WOLLENS GARDENS - Go west from Shadeland avenue on 56th street just a short distance to Brendon Forest Drive. Turn north and park along the street. Hike will start promptly at 3:00 P.M. - AUG 23 CLARK COUNTY STATE FOREST HIKE - Leave the east side of the State House at 7:30 A.M. Take U.S. 31 and I-65 south to the Henryville exit (about 95 miles) Follow State Forest signs to the entrance which is about 1/2 miles north of Henryville. Meet at the parking area in the campground, about a mile from the entrance. This hike is 15 miles, with 5, 9, and 12 mile alternate hikes available. Rugged and hilly. Bring trail lunch and water. - SEPT 5,6, 7 LABOR DAY WEEKEND - NATURAL BRIDGE STATE PARK, KENTUCKY. Reservations for this are filled. Any members who might like to drive over and hike with the group are welcome. The first hike will be at 2:00 P.M. Saturday from the lodge parking lot.
- SEPT 10 (THURSDAY EVENING) SOCIAL MEETING AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS. 7:30 P.M. at the Indiana National Branch Bank, 5635 North Illinois Street. Election of officers for the new club year beginning October 1, 1970, followed by a social and refreshments. Members who take pictures on hikes and outing are requested to bring 10 to 20 slides of recent events. It will be interesting to see ourselves in some of the candid poses that have undoubtedly been taken. - SEPT 13 PAINTED HILLS - Leave the east side of the State House at 1:15 P.M. Go south on Rt 37 to Martinsville. Take Rt 252 east (left) for 3-1/2 miles and park at the parking lot of the Painted Hills development. Hike will start from here at 2:30 P.M. An easy 3 to 5 miles around the lake. After the hike we have permission to park in the parking lot of the Grassy Forks fisheries in Martinsville and walk around the fish ponds. (Grassy Forks is not open on Sundays) Leader: Joe Wilhelm 241-8824
- SEPT 20 JACKSON-WASHINGTON STATE FOREST. - Leave the east side of the State House at 9:00 AM Take US 31 and I-65 south to state highway 256 exit. Reassemble just west of I-65 on SR 256. Please be on time, as we will leave at 10:30 AM sharp by caravan for the trail head. This is a new hike, about 12 miles, rugged. Bring a trail lunch and drinking water. - SEPT 27 METAMORA CANAL DAYS. (A visit to early Indiana and the days of canal travel). Leave the east side of the State House at 1:30 P.M. Take SR 52 southeast to Metamora, about 20 miles past Rushville. Assemble in the town at the bridge across the canal at 3:00 PM. for an easy 3 mile hike along the canal (viewing the aqueduct and the locks) After the hike, a visit in the old town of Metamora will be an interesting experience. The craft shops, the old homes, churches, and other buildings offer fascinating glimpses of the days of early Indiana (the 1840's). Canoe races in the canal will also be held as one of the events of this weekend. The canal boat "The Valley Belle" will be in operation, and for a fee, you can take a short ride on the old canal. - OCT 4 ANNUAL CAVE HIKE - TUMBLING WATERS. - Leave the east side of the State House at 1:00 PM. Take I-70 southwest from Indianapolis to the Little Point exit. Continue west and south on SR 42 for 1-1/2 miles south of Eminence, where SR 42 turns to the west. Leave SR 42 at this junction, and continue south on the county road about 6 miles to the park entrance. There is an entry fee of 50¢ per person with a maximum charge of \$2.00 per family (small children are free). There will be exploration of Porters Cave and also a hike above ground. For those going on the cave trip, bring a flashlight and some old shoes to change in to, as the cave may have 8 to 10 inches of water in places. The cave is 800 feet long with an entrance at each end. Bring food for a picnic afterward. Hike to start at 2:30 PM.
