AUG 8 SHAFFER LAKE - Leave the east side of the Statehouse at 12:30 P.M. Go north on SR 421 to Monticello (about 80 miles). Go west on road 24 about 3 miles to grain elevator which sets on north east corner. Turn right (Gurnsey road) and go north to road 5.6. Turn right 3/4 mile to cottage #2 (C.M. Moller) Assemble at 2:30 P.M. for hike. About 5 miles of hiking, a swim, and a picnic afterward. Bring folding chairs, tables, and food for a picnic. (Cold drinks will be furnished). AUG 15 ARBUCKLE ACRES PARK - Leave the east side of the Statehouse at 1:30 P.M. Take I-74 west to the Brownsburg exit. Turn right for one mile to Arbuckle Acres entrance on the right, and on this side of the railroad tracks. Go nearly to the end of the lane and use the parking lot on the right. 4 to 5 miles of easy hiking along the creek. Hiking will start at 2:00 P.M. Leader: Libby Moore 852 4717

AUG 22 PINE HILLS NATURAL AREA - Leave the east side of the Statehouse at 12:30 P.M. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Turn left and follow #75 to Jamestown where it intersects with Route 234. Take #234 west almost to the Shades State Park where #234 turns sharply right (north). Follow this for one mile north to the Pine Hills parking lot on the left side of the road. Hiking to start at 2:00 P.M. 5 miles - rugged. Wear old shoes or bring old shoes to change to as we will probably have to wade the creek. Leader: Ed Lavagnino 291 4495.

AUG 29 CAVE EXPLORATION - Leave the Statehouse at 8:00 A.M. Take Ind 37 to Bloomington. Rendezvous at 9:30 A.M. in the parking lot of the park at the north edge of the city where Ind 37 splits into two one-way streets. From there take Ind 37 to Ind 45. Go southwest on Ind 45 for 4 miles to Airport Road. Go west on Airport Road for 2-1/2 miles to the end of the black top. Go north for 1/4 mile to the first lane west. Go west 1/8 mile and park along the road. Hike to start at 10:00 A.M. and will last 5 hours. Most of the cave will permit standing or stooping walking. The cave will be wet and muddy with a temperature of 52 degrees. Bring a change of clothes, a good flashlight, and a sack lunch for eating inside the cave. It is suggested that the gals should wear slacks or jump suits, and it would be advisable for all to have a hard hat or good head covering of some kind. Our guide will be Robert Armstrong - a spelunker who knows this cave well. Leader: Jack Gainey 359 6492

- SEPT 12 PORTLAND ARCH AND BEAR CREEK CANYON - Leave the east side of the State House at 12:30 P.M. Take I-74 west to State Road 41. Turn right (north) on SR 41 and continue for 7 miles. Turn left (west) on 650-N (note sign pointing to Fountain) and go 5 miles to Fountain. Assemble at the rear of the Portland Arch General Store. Hike will begin at 2:30 P.M. Wear old shoes and bring others to change to, as we will wade some in Bear Creek. There are no facilities in the area, so we suggest a stop at the rest area on I-74 just 1-1/2 miles west of the Fountain County Line. The hike will be about 5 miles of moderate walking.
