(PLEASE NOTE: This edition of the Hiking Club schedule of hikes covers the months of July and August.)

- JULY 8 ANNUAL HIKING CLUB PICNIC - (For members and their invited guests only). Plan to arrive at H.T. Pritchard Park near Martinsville at 1:00 P.M. for social activities, games, and a short hike. Bring food to contribute to an old-fashioned pitch-in-dinner. Also bring your own table service and drinks. DINNER TO BE AT 4:00 P.M. Bring your badminton set, darts, frisbees or other games, and relaxing chairs. DIRECTIONS: Take SR 37 south to Maple Turn Road (8 miles south of Waverly). Watch for sign for Foxcliff addition. Turn right and go about 1/4 mile, then right again for about 3 miles to H.T. Pritchard Park, which is just across from the Power and Light Company plant. Hike Leader - Win Pulsifer.
- JULY 15 MCCORMICK'S CREEK STATE PARK - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 1:00 P.M. Take the route of your choice to the Park. Assemble in the parking area near the Canyon Inn. Hike to start at 2:30 P.M. 5 miles - moderate. Leader: Odie Cassetty. 244-9913. Entrance fee of \$1.25 per car, or season pass.
- JULY 22 BUTLER UNIVERSITY HIKE. - Take the route of your choice and assemble at the Butler University field house at 6:30 P.M. Hike to start at 6:45 P.M. The field house is at 49th street and Boulevard Place. Easy 3 mile hike around the campus. Leader: Hank Moore 852-4717.
- JULY 29 PINE HILLS NATURE PRESERVE - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 12:30 P.M. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Turn left and follow SR 75 to Jamestown where it intersects with SR 234. Take # 234 west almost to the Shades State Park where #234 turn sharply right (north). Follow this for one mile north to the Pine Hills Nature Preserve parking area on the left side of the road. Hike to start at 2:00 P.M. 5 miles - rugged. Either wear (or carry with you) tennis shoes or old shoes to wade the creek with as quite a bit of the hike will be down the creek bed. Leader: Ed Lavagnino 291-4495.
- AUG 5 MOUNDS STATE PARK - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 1:00 P.M. Go north-east on I-69 to Anderson (exit road 109 north) and follow signs to Mounds State Park, which is east of Anderson on the Muncie Road. Assemble at 2:30 P.M. at a parking area inside the entrance. Entrance fee of \$1.25 per car or season pass. About 3 miles of easy hiking visiting the Indian burial mounds. Leader: Bill Larrison 359 7538.
- AUG 12 METAMORA CANAL HIKE - Leave the Parking lot of the State House at 1:30 P.M. Take SR 52 southeast to Metamora, about 20 miles past Rushville. Turn right and go into the town and assemble at the auto bridge over the canal in the center of town. Easy 3 mile hike to start at 3:00 P.M. Leader: Geneva Ryan 784-1859
- AUG 19 JACKSON STATE FOREST - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 12:30 P.M. Take I-65 south to Seymour exit. Take U.S. 50 west to Brownstown and then SR 250 south about 3 miles to the Jackson State Forest entrance. Reassemble in the parking lot beyond the end of the lake at 2:30 P.M.. About 9 miles of moderate to rugged hiking in the hills of the forest. Bring food for a picnic lunch or cook-out after the hike. Leader: Jack Gainey 359-6492. There will be a short hike available also, so come on down and see the beauty of this State Forest.

Go west on 56th to the Eagle Creek reservoir and assemble in the parking lot on the west side of the causeway. Hike to start at 2:00 P.M. About 6 miles - moderate. Leader: Hank Moore 852 4717.

- SEP 13 (THURSDAY EVENING) SOCIAL & BUSINESS MEETING AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS - (For members and their invited guests only). 7:30 P.M. at the Indiana National Branch Bank, 5635 North Illinois Street. Our speaker for the evening will be a representative from the Division of Forestry of the Indiana Department of Natural Resources, discussing the multiple uses of the State Forests in Indiana, as well as the help the division gives in managing of private woodlands. - SEP 16 ARBUCKLE ACRES PARK - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 3:15 P.M. Take I-74 west to the Brownsburg exit. Turn right for one mile to Arbuckle Acres entrance on the right and on this side of the railroad tracks. Go nearly to the end of the lane and use the parking lot on the right. Hike to start at 4:00 P.M. About 3 to 4 miles - easy. Bring weiners and buns for a cook-out after the hike. Drinks will be furnished. Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717)
- SEP 22 BERNHEIM FOREST BUS TRIP - (Please note this in on SATURDAY) We will leave the Greyhound bus depot at 7:30 A.M. and return about 8:00 P.M. Meet our chartered bus at track #16 west gate on the south side of the depot. Bus fare is \$5.00 per person and the bus holds exactly 41 passengers, so reservations are necessary. Reserve space on the bus by sending your check made out to: THE INDIANAPOLIS HIKING CLUB - to Sylvia Retherford, 9244 Shenandoah Drive, Indianapolis, Ind. 46229. Bernheim Forest is a private 10,000 acre forest preserve located about 30 miles south of Louisville. It consists of an unusually lovely arboretum and a large primitive area. There will be an 8 mile hike in the primitive area, and there will be a short hike for those who prefer one. Bring your lunch as there is no food available in or near the forest. We will stop for dinner in a restaurant in Jeffersonville about 6:00 P.M. on the return trip.
- SEP 30 CAVE RIVER VALLEY - JOINT OUTING WITH THE HOOSIER GROUP OF THE SIERRA CLUB - Take U.S. #31 and I-65 south to the Seymour exit, then U.S. #50 west to Brownstown, then SR #135 south to Salem, then SR #60 west to Campbellsburg. Turn north in the center of the village of Campbellsburg for three miles and watch for signs to Cave River Valley. This valley is unique in that it has 7 caves to explore, surface hiking and trout fishing, and you pay for what you catch by the inch. The Sunday hike will start at 1:30 P.M. - about 4 miles, easy. Come early and bring a picnic lunch. It is about

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2-1/2 to 3 hours drive from Indianapolis. Camping is available and some members plan to come Saturday and camp overnight. Everyone is invited to join us and enjoy both days. Juanita Lauth will lead a cave hike on Saturday afternoon. The shelter has been reserved Saturday from 3:00 to 7:00 P.M. for those who wish to catch and cook trout. An entrance fee of 25¢ per car and 25¢ per person is charged. There is also a camping fee. Tents and small trailers can be accommodated. Leader: Ted Fields (253-7187). Focus in on Fun with this great fall outing. (No license required for the fishing)

OCT 7 HAPPY HOLLOW CAMP - This 800 acre Happy Hollow Children's Camp is located in a very scenic area of Brown County south of Gnaw Bone. Take I-65 south to the SR #46 exit for Columbus. Go west on #46 for about 12 or 13 miles (to about 2 miles west of Gnaw Bone). Go south on SR #135 about 5 miles to Stone Head, then left (east) on the Bellsville Pike about 4-1/2 miles to the Happy Hollow Camp entrance. Go through the entrance and continue about 4 blocks, then turn right up the hill to the parking area in the main cabin area. Hike to start at 2:00 P.M. About 5 to 6 miles of easy hiking. Leader: Nell Larrison (359-7538) There will be a 50¢ fee for this hike.
