



THE INDIANAPOLIS HIKING CLUB
June and July, 1974

- JUN 9 YELLOWWOOD LAKE - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 12:30 P.M. Take S.R. 135 south to Nashville and then go west on S.R. 46 about 7 miles to the sign for Yellowwood State Forest. Turn north to the forest following the blacktop (being sure to turn left after crossing the old iron bridge). Park at the Boy Scout camping area at the far north end of the lake. Hiking will start at 2:00 P.M. 4 to 6 miles - moderate. Leaders: Herb and Betty Leyendecker (898 4143).
- JUN 16 TOWPATH HIKE - Assemble near the Observatory on the Butler University campus at 2:30 PM. For those using public transportation, take the North Meridian - Butler bus north from the circle. Easy hiking along the towpath - about 5 miles. Leader: Walter Handy (359 4126). NOTE: Do not park down in the Holcomb Gardens area.
- JUN 22 (SATURDAY) Juanita Lauth has arranged for a visitation and hike at the CONNER PRAIRIE FARM AND MUSEUM. Please call her at 353 6325 by June 8th if you are interested, as she needs to notify the girl scouts as to the approximate number. Admission is \$2.00 and the hike fee is \$1.00. The hike fee goes to the girl scouts. The Conner Prairie Farm is on road 37-A about 7 miles north of the intersection of road 100. (This is the old road to Noblesville). The Farm consists of a museum and a restoration of an early pioneer town in the formative days of Indiana. You will see many of the activities that took place in such a village. Please be at the parking area inside the gate by 9:30 A.M., and the 10 mile girl scout hike will start at 9:45. We will follow a trail which the girl scouts have developed in this area. Bring food and drinks for a picnic lunch after the hike. After lunch we will visit the pioneer village and museum. (NOTE: If you haven't notified Juanita by June 8th, but at the last minute decide you would like to join the crowd, please come on up. However, please call Juanita (353 6325) if at all possible)
- JUN 23 SHADES STATE PARK - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 1:00 P.M. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Go into Jamestown and then continue on S.R. 234 on west to the Shades State Park. Assemble in the picnic area parking near the campground. Hike to start at 2:30 PM.. About 5 miles of rugged hiking. Leader: Odie Cassetty (244 9913)
- JUN 30 MORGAN- MONROE STATE FOREST - Leave the parking lot ^{of} the State House at 1:00 P.M. Take S.R. 37 south to about 7 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the State Forest sign and follow the old road about 4 miles to entrance to the Forest. Turn left into the State Forest and drive to the fire tower (about 5 miles from the entrance) Assemble in the parking lot here at 2:30 P.M. for about 5 miles of moderate hiking. Leader: Bill Larrison (359 7538)
- JUL 7 METAMORA CANAL HIKE - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 1:30 P.M. Take S.R. 52 southeast to Metamora, about 20 miles past Rushville. Turn right and go into the town. Assemble at the auto bridge in the center of town (over the canal) at 3:00 PM. Easy 3 mile hike. Leader: Geneva Ryan (784-1859)
- JUL 13 (SATURDAY) ANNUAL HIKING CLUB PICNIC - For members and their invited guests only!! PLACE: Eagle Creek Park. Proceed to west 56th Street by route of your choice and the entrance to the Park is just west of Reed Road and just east of the causeway. Entrance fee is \$1.00 for cars with Marion county license plates, and \$2.00 for all others. The Indianapolis Hiking Club has reserved Shelter House "A" from 11:00 A.M. until 8:00 P.M. There is swimming, boating, fishing, hiking, canoe rentals, and sailboats. Nominal fees are charged. You may also visit the Indian Museum which is just south of 56th Street. We plan to have a hike at 3:00 P.M. (short and easy) and our old-fashioned pitch-in dinner at 5:00 P.M. Bring food to contribute. Also your own table service and

drinks. PLEASE USE ICE CHESTS TO PROTECT YOUR FOOD FROM THE HEAT. Also bring your favorite games - badminton sets, darts, frisbees, etc. Also some relaxing folding chairs will come in handy. There are sightseeing pontoon boats, and after supper it might be nice to take a relaxing cruise and see the reservoir from a new point of view. There is a fee for this boat ride. (REMEMBER: NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE PERMITTED IN THE PARK).

- JUL 21 TURKEY RUN STATE PARK - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 12:30 P.M. Go west on highway #36 to Rockville, then go north on Road #41 about 8 miles to road #47. Turn right and go about 3 miles to the Park entrance. Assemble at the parking area near the commissary at 2:30 P.M. About 5 to 6 miles of moderate hiking along picturesque trails. Leader: Win Pulsifer (784 1835) Note: Always bring rain gear on any of Win's hikes)
- JUL 28 PINE HILLS NATURE PRESERVE - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 12:30 P.M. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Turn left and follow SR 75 into Jamestown. Take SR 234 west almost to the Shades State Park where #234 turns sharply right (north). Follow this for 1 mile north to the Pine Hills parking area on the left side of the road. Hike to start at 2:30 P.M. 5 miles - rugged. Either wear (or else carry with) some old shoes or canvas shoes as quite a bit of the hike will be down the creek bed, and we will have to do a good deal of wading. Leader: Jack Gainey (545 4548)
