Schedule for -- June and July 1975

PLEASE: No pets on hikes

- JUN 8 WEED PATCH HILL - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 8:00 A.M. and take SR 135 south to Brown County State Park. Meet at the Fire Tower in the park at 9:30 A.M. for about 16 to 18 miles of rugged hiking. Bring a trail lunch and drinking water. Leader: Ray DeFalque (291 8059). There will be a leader for a shorter hike also.
- JUN 15 MISSISSINEWA TRAIL - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 9:00 A.M. Take US 31 north to Peru, Ind. Best to follow business 31, US 24. Turn right at highway #21. Immediately across bridge turn left (highway 124). Go about 7-1/2 miles to road 675 E. Turn right about 2 miles to "T". Turn right and in a short distance you will see a phone booth on the left. Turn into the far parking area. Bring water and food to eat on the trail. Hike to start at 11:00 A.M. Sharp! BE ON TIME. About 12 miles - moderate to rugged. Leaders: Harrison and David Feldman (251 0562)
- JUN 22 ARBUCKLE ACRES - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 1:30 PM. Take I-74 west to the Brownsburg exit. Turn right for one mile to Arbuckle Acres entrance on the right and just before the railroad tracks. Go nearly to the end of the lane and meet in the parking lot. 4 to 5 miles of easy hiking along the creek, to start at 2:30 P.M. Leader - Hank Moore.
- JUN 29 SHADES STATE PARK - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 1:00 P.M. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Go into Jamestown and then follow #234 west to the Shades Park entrance. Assemble in the parking area near the picnic area at 2:30 PM for about 5 miles of moderate hiking. Leader: Odie Cassetty (244 9913). Admission charge to Park.
- JUL 6 BROWNING MOUNTAIN - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 10:00 AM. Take SR 135 south to Storey (about 15 miles south of Nashville). Assemble in the parking lot of the General Store. PLEASE DO NOT BE LATE. Hike to start at 12:00 noon. Bring trail lunch and water for 10 miles of moderate to rugged hiking. Leader: John Williams (253 5710)
- JUL 12 (SATURDAY) ANNUAL HIKING CLUB PICNIC -(For members and their invited guests only)
PLACE: Eagle Creek Park. Proceed to west 56th street by route of your choice and the entrance is just east of the causeway. Entrance fee \$1.00 for cars with Marion county licenses, and \$2.00 for all others. We have reserved Shelter House "B" from 11:00 AM until 8:00 PM. There is swimming, boating, and fishing in the reservoir at nominal fees. We plan to have a hike about 2:30 or 3:00 PM. and our old-fashioned pitch-in supper at 5:00 PM. Bring food to contribute. Also your own table service and drinks. PLEASE USE ICE CHESTS TO PROTECT YOUR FOOD FROM THE HEAT. Also bring your favorite games, and some relaxing folding chairs. (NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE PERMITTED IN THE PARK)
- JUL 13 EAGLE CREEK PARK - Proceed by route of your choice to west 56th street entrance to Eagle Creek Park. Meet in the parking lot on right hand side of the road just past the gate house. Hike to start at 2:30 = about 5 miles of easy hiking. Admission charge to the park. Leaders: Joe & Katherine Lehman 297 1632.
- JUL 20 PINE HILLS NATURE PRESERVE - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 12:00 noon. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Turn left and follow SR 75 into Jamestown. Take SR 234 west almost to the Shades State Park where #234 turns sharply right. Follow this for 1 mile north to the Pine Hills parking area. Hike to start at 2:00 P.M. about 5 miles - rugged. Bring old shoes as we may have to do quite a bit of wading down the creek. Leader: Jack Gainey (545 4548)

JUL 27 TURKEY RUN STATE PARK - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 12:00 noon. Go west on SR #36 to Rockville, then go north on #41 about 8 miles to road #47. Turn right and go about 3 miles to the park entrance. Meet in the parking area near the commissary at 2:00 PM. About 5 to 6 miles - moderate. Leader: Win Pulsifer (784 1835) There is an admission to the park.

And another time, when asked to do something, there was some rough language used in talking back to Mrs. Lorenz. The club has apologized for this. Even though the owners of the camp expect the Hiking Club to plan the program and to be responsible for the children's activities, they still may set down certain rules for the club to follow, such as; no children at the lake without adult supervision, preferably parents. Gnaw Bone Camp does not furnish counselors for an outing such as ours, as they expect the parents to maintain complete supervision for the safety and welfare of the children. This seems to be a reasonable request, and should not in any way interfere with the fun and play. Perhaps in the future it would be wise to have an orientation discussion early in an outing, in order that everyone knows the "rules and regulations" of camp behavior.
