Schedule for Aug and Sept 1976

(PLEASE: NO PETS ON HIKES)

During the humid days of summer let's all remember the immortal words of our publicity head, Phil Lin - "Only Englishmen, mad dogs, and hikers go out in the noon day sun"

- AUG 1 MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - Allow 1-1/4 hours driving time. Take S.R. 37 south to about 7 miles south of Martinsville. Turn Left at the State Forest sign and follow the old road about 4 miles to the entrance to the forest. Turn left and drive about 5 miles to the fire tower. Assemble in the parking lot of the fire tower at 2:00 PM for about 6 miles (more or less) of moderate hiking. Leader: Bill Flora (898 0760) (Wear rugged shoes)
- AUG 8 PORTLAND ARCH NATURE PRESERVE AND BEAR CREEK - Leave Indianapolis about 11:30 A.M. Take I-74 to U.S. 41 (19 miles west of Crawfordsville). Turn right (north). Go about 7 miles to road 650 N. (Note sign to Fountain). Turn left (west) about 5 miles to Fountain to sign directing you to left (south) to Portland Arch. About 4/10 of a mile to parking lot. Hike to start at parking lot at 1:30 P.M. Wear old shoes and take another to change into for part of hike will be in Bear Creek down to the Wabash River. There are no facilities, so stop at the rest area about 1-1/2 miles from Fountain County line. Hike about 4 to 5 miles, mostly moderate with a few steep hills. Bring insect repellant. Leader: Win Pulsifer (784-1835).
- AUG 15 ANNUAL CLEAN-UP HIKE - Go northeast on Fall Creek Parkway to Keystone Avenue. Park in Town and Country shopping center parking area - near Tuchman Cleaners. Hike to start at 1:30 P.M. - 5 to 6 miles, easy. Leader: Harrison Feldman (Trash bags will be provided)
- AUG 22 FOREST PARK HIKE & SWIM AT MORSE RESERVOIR BEACH - Go north on S.R. 37 to Noblesville and assemble at 2:00 P.M. at south entrance to the Court House. We will then proceed to Forest Park and over to the dam and beach at Morse Reservoir. We will then return to Forest Park for a cook-out. Bring your own food. Hike will be about 5 to 6 miles. Leader: Vic Knarr (774-3149) (Don't forget your bathing suits.)
- AUG 29 METAMORA CANAL HIKE - (Allow 1-1/2 hours driving time) Take U.S. 52 southeast to Metamora, (about 20 miles past Rushville). Turn right and go into the town and assemble at the auto bridge over the canal in the center of town. Easy - about 3 miles. Hike to start at 3:00 P.M. Leader: Tom Hill (784-2784).
- SEPT 4, 5, and 6. LABOR DAY WEEKEND AT HUESTON WOODS STATE PARK - (For members and their invited guests, only) The reservation supplement is being mailed to our members along with this schedule. Please refer to it for details. There is a campground in the Park and some may prefer to camp. Anyone who wants to attend our Sunday evening banquet and social at the Lodge, must fill out the reservation form, and indicate that they want to attend the banquet, and mail \$5.50 for each person. We must know in advance how many will be at the banquet, as we must notify the convention manager. Our first hike will be about 2:30 from the front of the Lodge - and a complete schedule of planned activities will be given out.
- SEP 9 (THURSDAY EVENING) ELECTION OF OFFICERS, BUSINESS MEETING & SOCIAL - (For members and their invited guest only). 7:30 P.M. Thursday evening at the Indiana National Bank branch at 5635 N. Illinois. SEP 12 JACKSON STATE FOREST - (Allow 2 hours driving time) Take I-65 south to the Seymour exit, and take U.S. 50 west to Brownstown. Take SR. 250 south about 3 miles to Jackson State Forest, and assemble in the parking lot beyond the lake at 1:00 P.M. for about 8 to 9 miles of rugged hiking. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538)

SEP 19 DUBOIS RIDGE - Leave the parking lot of the State House at 9:00 A.M. Take SR 135 south to Nashville. Go west on SR 46 about 6 miles to the sign for Yellowwood State Forest. Turn right and follow the winding road to the steel bridge where you turn left. Follow this narrow road to the north end of the Lake and park in the parking area near the group camping area. Hike to start at 10:30 AM Bring trail lunch and drinking water. Trail could be muddy - about 10 miles, moderate to rugged. Leader: Peg Franzen. 546 3185

SEP 26 BUTLER UNIVERSITY AND TOW PATH. Take route of your choice to Hinkle field house parking lot. Park near Theatron (west 49th street and Boulevard Place.) Hike to start at 1:30 P.M. 6 miles - easy. Leader: David Feldman (251-0562)
