SCHEDULE FOR AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER, 1978

(PLEASE - NO PETS ON HIKES)

- AUG 13 PORTLAND ARCH NATURE PRESERVE - (Allow 2 hours travel time). Take I-74 west to US 41. Turn right (north) and go about 7 miles to road 650 N. Turn left (west) and go about 5 miles to Fountain and watch for sign directing you to the left (south) to Portland Arch, about 4/10 mile to parking lot. Hike to start at 1:30 P.M. Bring old shoes to change to for hiking down Bear Creek to the Wabash. No facilities in the preserve, so stop at the rest area on I-74 west of Crawfordsville. About 4 to 5 miles of mostly moderate hiking with a couple of steep hills. Leader: Win Pulsifer (784 1835)
- AUG 20 CROOKED CREEK TRAIL - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 135 south to Nashville, then SR 46 west 5.1 miles. Look for a church-like building on the right (now an antique shop). On the opposite side is the Crooked Creek Road. Turn left and go about 2.7 miles to the parking area just below the dam. Hike to start at 10:30 AM. About 12 miles (19.2 km) moderate to rugged. Also a 6 mile shorter hike. Bring trail lunch and drinking water. Leader: Tom Hill (784 2784)
- AUG 27 MORGAN-MONROE FOREST - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to about 7 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the State Forest sign and follow the old road about 4 miles to the entrance to the Forest. Turn left and drive about 5 miles to the fire tower parking area. Hike to start at 1:30 P.M. Rugged - about 9 miles (14.4 km). Leader: George Newhall (844 0446).
- 2, 3, and 4 LABOR DAY WEEKEND AT SHAWNEE STATE PARK - (For members and their invited guests only). Reservation supplement is being mailed with this schedule. Anyone desiring to camp, please let Bill Larrison know, and arrange your money for the Sunday evening banquet. Our first hike will be about 2:00 PM on Saturday. - SEP 10 GLENDALE SHOPPING CENTER - CIRCLE HIKE - Assemble at Glendale Shopping Center in parking lot on the east side of Rural St. Hike to start at 8:00 AM. There will be a short hike of 9 miles (14.4 km) and a long hike of 20 miles (32 km). Short hikers will have to arrange their own transportation from downtown to Glendale. Suggestion: Short hikers can take bus from downtown directly to Glendale - then hike back downtown to their car. Bring trail lunch and water. We will picnic in University Park. Leaders: Tom Patterson (849 9528) and Charles Brunette (253 2576).
- SEP 14 (THURSDAY EVENING) ELECTION OF OFFICERS, BUSINESS MEETING AND SOCIAL - (For members and their invited guests only). 7:30 PM at the meeting room of the Merchants National Branch Bank at 5716 Crawfordsville Road (about 2 blocks east of I-465 in Speedway shopping center). Enter through right side door. The nominating committee, under the chairmanship of Fred Eckstein, presents the following slate of candidates for the year beginning October 1, 1978. PRESIDENT - Henry Moore VICE-PRESIDENT - Charles Brunette SECRETARY - Margaret Woodard TREASURER - Betty Blage PATH-FINDER - Marsha Hutchins. DIRECTORS - Harrison Feldman, Robert Begeman, Peggy Franzen, and Rose Stockwell. Further nominations may be made from the floor if properly moved and seconded. All persons nominated from the floor must be present. After the election and business meeting, Steve Warner will show slides and talk about his experiences during a recent trip to Russia. Refreshments will be served. In accordance with the By-Laws of the Club Constitution, the officers will recommend to the General Assembly that there be no increase in dues for the new year beginning October 1, 1978.

- SEP 17 MISSISSINAWA TRAIL - Allow about 2 hours travel time. Take US 31 north, and approximately 5 miles south of Peru watch for SR # 218, but do not turn on it. Proceed 1 mile north of SR 218 to next intersection. Turn right and drive 7-1/2 miles. Turn left (north) and go 1-3/4 miles. Turn right (east) and after crossing the dam turn right into the parking lot. If confused, please watch for signs leading you to the Dam. These roads have lots of chuckholes. Hike to start at 11:00 AM. Bring a trail lunch and drinking water. About 12 miles (19.2 km) - moderate to rugged. There is a trail patch available. Leader: Harrison Feldman (251 0562).
- SEP 24 FOUR LAKE HIKE - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to about 7 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left onto the old highway at sign for State Forest. Go about 3 miles to the entrance to the State Forest. Turn left into the Forest and then immediately turn right to the parking lot for Bryant Creek Lake. Hike to start at 10:00 A.M. About 14 miles (22.4 km). Bring trail lunch and water. Leaders: Ed Chambers and Ralph Chambers (241 1555).
- OCT 1 THERE WILL BE TWO HIKES (A) YELLOWWOOD TRAIL (B) LIEBER STATE PARK.
- (A) YELLOWWOOD TRAIL - Allow about 1-1/2 hours travel time. Go south on SR 135 to Beanblossom. Turn left (east) on blacktop road opposite SR 45. Go east 2.7 miles to the first gravel road on the right. (Bear Wallow Road). Turn right and drive 0.9 mile to the top of the hill to trail headquarters. Assemble at 6:30 A.M. There will be a car shuttle. Also a registration fee of 25¢ ea. Patch is available. Bring trail lunch and water. Rugged - 20 miles (32 km). (NOTE: The short Yellowwood trail will be hiked on Nov 12th). Leader: Charles Brunette (253 2576)
- (B) LIEBER STATE PARK - Allow about 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take I-70 West to exit for SR 243 (The next exit after the Cloverdale exit). Turn south and go the Lieber State Park. There will be an entrance fee. Assemble in the picnic parking lot which is the left fork near the end of the road to the Beach. Hike to start at 1:30 P.M. About 6 to 7 miles of easy to moderate hiking. Leader: Bill Larrison (359 7538)
