OCT 13 & 14 TWO EVENTS THIS WEEKEND

(A) OVERNIGHT OUTING AT LINCOLN STATE PARK - (For members and their invited guests only.) This event has been sold out, and there are no more openings. For those who have reservations, please plan to arrive by noon on Saturday. Check in the Park Office for cabin assignment and payment of rental. Our first hike will be around 2:30 PM on Saturday. (B) (SUNDAY) FALL CREEK HIKE - Meet at the Town and Country Shopping Center near Tuchman Cleaners, 4401 North Keystone, for an easy 5 mile hike which will start at 2:00 PM. Leader: Harrison Feldman (251-0562)

OCT 20 (SATURDAY) BEARS OF BLUE RIVER TRAIL - Take I-74 southeast 20 miles to SR 9. Turn left (north) on SR 9, and go one block to Morristown Road, and turn right and go 1/2 mile to the WSVL radio station on the right side. Allow one hour driving time with hike starting PROMPTLY at 8:30 AM, due to need for car shuttle. Bring trail lunch and water for a moderate 14 mile hike. Patch available. Leader: John Behrmann (462-9286)

OCT 21 GRASSYFORK FISHERY HIKE - Allow 1-1/2 hours driving time. Take SR 37 south to SR 252 (the first stoplight on the Martinsville By-pass). Turn right and go to "T". Turn left (west) on Morgan Street. Go three blocks to yellow blinker. Turn right on Home Avenue and go about three blocks to the park. Meet at the shelter house #1. Hike to start at 1:30 PM and will be easy to moderate and about 7 miles long. Leader: Clyde Fulkerson (1- 342-4144).

OCT 28 THERE WILL BE TWO HIKES.

(A) MISSISSINewa TRAIL - Allow about 2 hours travel time. Take US 31 north. Approximately 5 miles south of Peru watch for SR 218, but do not turn on it. Proceed one mile north of SR 218 to the next intersection. Turn right and drive about 7-1/2 miles. Turn left (north) and go 1-3/4 miles. Turn right (east). After crossing the dam turn right into the parking lot. If confused, please watch for signs directing you to dam. Hike will start at 11:00 AM. Bring trail lunch and drinking water. A patch is available for this 12 mile moderate to rugged hike. Leader: Harrison Feldman (251-0562).

(B) SOUTHWESTWAY PARK - Take US 31 south to I-465. Then go west to the Mann Road exit. Go south on Mann Road about four miles to Southwestway Park. (NOTE: For those coming from the west, there is no exit for Mann Road. So take the SR 67 (Kentucky Ave) exit. Go southwest on SR 67, then south on High School Road, and east on Thompson Road, and then south on Mann Road to the Park.). Meet in the golf course parking lot at 2:30 PM for 4 to 5 miles of easy hiking. Leaders: Grace & Joe Breimeir (787-8002).

NOV 4 THERE WILL BE TWO HIKES.

(A) YELLOWWOOD TRAIL - Allow 1-1/2 hours for travel. Go south on SR 135 to Beanblossom. Turn left on the blacktop road opposite SR 45. Go 2.7 miles to the first gravel road on the right (Bear Wallow Road). Turn right and drive 0.9 mile to the top of the hill. Assemble at Trail Headquarters at 7:00 AM for car shuttle. BE ON TIME!!! Registration fee is 50¢. Patch is available for this rugged 20 mile hike. Bring trail lunch and water. Leader: Charles Brunette: (542-7846)

(B) MUSCATATUCK NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE - Allow 2 hours travel time. Go south on I-65 to the US 50 exit at Seymour. Go east on US 50 about three miles to the entrance to Muscatatuck on the right. Meet at the visitor center just a short distance inside the entrance (on the right) at 1:30 PM for 5 to 7 miles of easy hiking. With any luck there will be waterfowl on their annual migration. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538)

- NOV 8 (THURSDAY EVENING) - Business Meeting and Club Social (For members and their guests only)
Meet at 7:30 PM in the meeting room of the Merchants National Branch Bank at 5716
Crawfordsville Road. This is about 2 blocks east of I-465 in the Speedway Shopping
Center. Enter through the side door to the basement room. A short business meeting
followed by the evening's program. Dr. Noel Jones of the Eli Lilly Physical
Chemical Research Dept. will present slides and a talk on "UNDERWATER ARCHAEOLOGY"
He was part of an expedition that explored a sunken Portugese Frigate on the coast of
Kenya.
- NOV 11 SHADES STATE PARK - Allow 1-1/2 hours for travel time. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown
exit. Go through Jamestown and take SR 234 west to the Park. There will be entrance
fee. Drive through the Pavilion, follow the road to the right, and park near the
shelter house. Moderate hikes of about 4, 9, and 15 miles will start at 9:45 AM.
Bring lunch (which may be left in car) and drinking water. Leader: Marsha Hutchins

- NOV 18 BROWN COUNTY STATE PARK - Allow 2 hours travel time. Take SR 135 south through
Nashville to Brown County State Park. There will be an admission fee. Meet at the
fire tower at 10:30 AM for 8 and 11 miles of moderate to rugged hiking. Bring trail
lunch and water. Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717)
- NOV 25 RACCOON LAKE STATE RECREATION AREA - Allow 1-1/2 hours for travel. Take US 36 west to
Raccoon Lake Area. There will be an entrance fee. Park in the first parking area on
the left. Meet at 1:00 PM for a moderate 7 mile hike. Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439)
- DEC 1 (SATURDAY) AMERICAN HERITAGE TRAIL - Allow 1-1/2 hours for travel. Go south on SR 135
to Beanblossom. Turn left on the blacktop road opposite SR 45. Go 2.7 miles to the
first gravel road on the right (Bear Wallow Road). Turn right and drive 0.9 mile to
Trail Headquarters at the top of the hill. Meet at 9:30 AM for a moderate 12 mile
hike. Bring trail lunch and water. Registration fee is 50¢, and patches and medals
are available. Leader: Cliff Hoard (896-2129)
- DEC 2 SOUTHEASTWAY PARK - Allow 3/4 hour travel time. Take I-74 southeast to the Pleasant
View exit. Turn left and go into town. Turn left at the "T", and go 1/2 mile to
the bank parking lot. Easy hike of 5 miles will start at 2:00 PM. Leaders: Tom
Hill (784-2784) and Dora Buehler (787-6870).
- DEC 8 (SATURDAY) ANNUAL CHRISTMAS PARTY - (For members and their invited guests only)
PLACE: North Liberty Christian Church, 6001 W. 52nd Street. Take either 38th street
or 56th street to High School Road (6300 West). Go to 52nd and High School Road and
then go 2 blocks east on 52nd street to the Church on the south side of the street.
ARRIVAL TIME: 6:00 PM. We will have a old-fashioned pitch-in dinner to start at
6:30 PM. Please be on time and bring food according to the size of your family group.
Bring your own plates and silverware. The club will furnish hot and cold drinks, and
