- FEB 13 AND 14 WINTER OVERNIGHT AT HUESTON WOODS STATE PARK - (This event is for members and their invited guests only). The previous schedule contained the details of the overnight outing. For more information please contact Bill Larrison (359 7538). (NOTE: The telephone number at Hueston Woods is (513) 523-6381. This information for those who may wish to leave the number where they can be reached).
- FEB 14 (Sunday) CANAL FROM BROAD RIPPLE TO BUTLER - Meet in the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple (on Westfield just east of College) at 2:00 PM for an easy hike of 5 miles. Leader: Hank Moore (852-4717).
- FEB 15 (Monday) PRESIDENTS' DAY DOWNTOWN HIKE WITH TOUR OF INDIANA REPERTORY THEATER. Meet at 12:15 PM in front of the Riley home, which is on Lockerbie Street between East street and Park avenue. (Lockerbie is south of Michigan and north of New York). There will be an easy 2 to 2-1/2 mile hike. There is no admission charge for the I.R.T. tour, but donations are accepted. Leader: Alberta Neill (634-7672).
- FEB 21 (Sunday) FORT BENJAMIN HARRISON - Take SR 67 (Pendleton Pike) northeast to Post Road. Go north and turn left just past the railroad tracks to park in the east lot of the Army Finance Center. There will be an easy hike of 6 miles and an easy to moderate hike of 12 miles. Those going on the longer hike should wear boots. Hikes start at 12:00 noon. Leader: George Newhall (823-6534).
- FEB 27 (Saturday) SOUTH GROVE, COFFIN, AND RIVERSIDE GOLF COURSES, AND RIVERSIDE PARK. Park in the lot of the Park Department Headquarters at 1426 West 29th Street. (NOTE: this street is one-way going east). Meet at 12:00 noon for easy hikes of 4 and 8 miles. Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717).
- FEB 28 (Sunday) INDIANAPOLIS MOTOR SPEEDWAY - Take West 16th street to the Speedway Museum entrance (4790 W. 16th), and park in the Museum parking lot. About 4 to 5 miles of easy hiking around the ground and track. Hike to start at 1:30 PM. Those who wish to visit the museum should do so before the hike as they may not have time enough afterwards. (Admission fee to museum). Leader: Nell Larrison (359 7538).
- MAR 6 (Saturday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the State Forest sign, and go about 4 miles to the Morgan-Monroe State Forest entrance. Turn left and continue about 5 miles to the fire tower parking area. Meet at 10:00 AM for a moderate to rugged 12 mile hike. Bring trail lunch and drinking water. Leader: George Newhall (823-6534).
- MAR 7 (Sunday) WEST SIDE OF EAGLE CREEK RESERVOIR - Take west 56th street to the Eagle Creek Reservoir and assemble in the lot that is west of the causeway. Please deposit a 50¢ entrance fee in the standpipe as directed by the sign. Meet at 2:00 PM for a moderate 5 mile hike. Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717).

- MAR 11 (Thursday) GENERAL ASSEMBLY - (For members and their invited guests). Meet at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall of the Covenant Presbyterian Church at 2305 N. Kitley. (Park in the rear and enter from the parking lot). DIRECTIONS: Kitley is 6500 East, midway between Arlington and Shadeland on 21st street. Go north on Kitley from 21st to the second church on the right. There will be a short business meeting, and then the program for the evening. Mr. Marty Risch, Marina manager at Eagle Creek Park, will speak on "A Day in the Life of a PARK RANGER". Mr. Risch has had many years of experience as a park ranger. Refreshments will be served.
- MAR 14 (Sunday) SPEEDWAY LEVEE HIKE AND THATCHER COMMUNITY HIKE -- Take route of your choice to the 6200 block of west 10th street. Just east of I-465. Go north on Vinewood Drive one half block to High School Road. Turn left and follow High School Road to Westwood Country Club. (1501 north High School Road). The SPEEDWAY LEVEE will start at 12:00 noon and cover 4 miles. Leaders: Odie & Phyllis Cassetty (244 9913). The THATCHER COMMUNITY hike will start at 2:00 PM and will cover 6 miles. Leaders: Frank & Wilma Thompson (241 7154). NOTE: Both hikes will start from Westwood Country Club. The first will be done before the second starts. You can take both or either.
- MAR 20 (Saturday) KNOBSTONE CIRCLE TRAIL -(Jackson Road Trailhead to Deam Lake Trailhead via Reed Road Trail). Come prepared for mud. Allow 2-3/4 hours driving time. Take I-65 south to the Hamburg exit. Go west on SR 60 to Hamburg, then continue west on SR 60 for five more miles. Turn right (north) at the Clark-Floyd Landfill sign. Stay on the asphalt road and go about 3-1/2 miles to the second T-road on the left. Turn left (west) on Wilson Switch Road and go 0.6 miles to the Deam Lake Trailhead. Meet at 10:00 AM for a moderate to rugged hike of 10 to 11 miles. Bring trail lunch and water. Leaders: Heydon & Peggy Franzen (546-3185). (NOTE: To those taking both the Saturday and also the Sunday Knobstone Hikes, the leaders are planning to camp at the Clark State Forest camp north of Henryville on SR 31. Motels are also in the area)
- MAR 21 "A" (Sunday) KNOBSTONE TRAIL (Jackson Road Trailhead to the New Chapel Trailhead). Allow 2-1/4 hours travel time. Go south on I-65 to the Henryville Exit. Go west on SR 160 for 5.6 miles. Turn right on New Chapel Road. Go north 1/2 mile to the New Chapel Trailhead parking area on the right. Meet at 9:30 AM. BE PROMPT DUE TO CAR SHUTTLE. Bring trail lunch and water for this rugged hike of 14 miles. It is suggested that you use the facilities at the Henryville Rest Stop. Leaders: Heydon & Peggy Franzen (546-3185).
"B" (Sunday) SOUTHWESTWAY PARK - Take SR 37 south to Southport Road. Go west on Southport Road to Mann Road. Turn left and go to the Park. Assemble in the golf course parking lot at 2:30 PM for easy 4 mile hike: Leader: Joe Breimeir (787-8002).
- MAR 28 (Sunday) CASCADE PARK - Take SR 37 south to Bloomington. Use the College Avenue exit. Go 2.2 miles, and immediately after a small bridge, turn right. Continue 0.9 miles to Cascade Park on the right. Turn right, ford a small creek, and park. If you don't want to ford the creek, you can park on the left before you get to it. Meet in the shelter house for a moderate hike of 5 to 6 miles beginning at 2:00 PM. Leader: Fred Eckstein (996-2597).
- MAR 28 through APR 3 (Sunday through Saturday) BACKPACK IN THE GREAT SMOKY MOUNTAINS NATIONAL PARK. Plans call for 5 to 7 miles of hiking per day with packs and for one layover day with optional hiking. For information and reservations contact Ron Craig (work 240-2373, home 255-6215).
- MAR 30 (Tuesday) CROWN HILL CEMETERY - Enter through the gate on Clarendon Road just north of West 38th Street. Park on the circle drive leading around the Mausoleum. Easy hike of 4 miles starting at 2:00 PM. Leader: Dorothy Field (253-7114).

APR 4 (Sunday) VERSAILLES STATE PARK - Allow about 2 hours driving time. Take I-74 south-east to the Greensburg exit. Then follow US 421 south to Versailles, and go east on US 50 about 2 miles to the State Park entrance. (Fee). Follow the park road up the steep hill to the main picnic parking area. Meet at 1:00 PM for a moderate to rugged hike of 6 to 7 miles. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538).

ADVANCE NOTICES: Backpack in Glacier-Waterton International Peace Park (Montana & Alberta) For information and reservations, contact Linda Elliott (634-1842). As of now plans call for a 12 mile day hike on Monday, July 5, and 35 miles of backpacking from Tuesday, July 6, through Saturday, July 10. There will be a layover day in Waterton on Sunday, July 11, during which supplies may be replenished. People who prefer a one-week trip may leave or join the group there. From Monday, July 12 through Friday, July 16, there will be 40 miles of backpacking plus optional day hiking. A total of 98 to 99 miles is possible for the entire trip.

This trip is scheduled for Aug 3 to Aug 7, and will start at Grand Marais, Minnesota. Equipment and central food will be provided by a professional outfitter.
