SCHEDULE FOR AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER, 1982

(PLEASE - NO PETS ON HIKES)

***** 1982 - OUR SILVER ANNIVERSARY YEAR *****

- AUG 7 (Saturday) MISSISSINEWA TRAIL - Allow about 2 hours travel time. Take US 31 north. Approximately 5 miles south of Peru watch for SR 218, but DO NOT TURN ON IT. Proceed one mile north of SR 218 to the next intersection. Turn right and drive about 7-1/2 miles. Turn left (north) and go 1-3/4 miles. Turn right (east). After crossing the dam turn right into the parking lot. If confused, watch for signs directing you to the dam. Hike will start at 11:00 AM. Bring trail lunch and drinking water. A patch is available for this 10 mile moderate to rugged hike. Leader: Harrison Feldman (251-0562).
- AUG 8 (Sunday) MOUNDS STATE PARK - Take I-69 north to the second Anderson exit. Go north on SR 109 to SR 232. Turn right and continue to the park. There will be an entrance fee. Assemble by the artesian well near the Boy Scout Camp at the end of the road at 2:00 PM for an easy 5 mile hike. Leader: Bob Begeman (359-4174).
- AUG 12 (Thursday) DELAWARE LAKE AT FORT HARRISON - Go north on Post Road to 56th street. Turn right and go one mile to Lee Road. Turn left and go north to 63rd street. Turn left and go to the ~~second~~ ^{third} road on the right. Meet at 9:00 AM for a moderate to rugged hike of 6 miles. WEAR HIKING BOOTS due to trail conditions. Bring drinking water and insect repellant. Leader: George Newhall (823-6534).
- AUG 15 (Sunday) FOREST PARK HIKE AND SWIM AT MORSE RESERVOIR BEACH - Take SR 37 north and SR 32 west to Noblesville. Assemble at 2:00 PM on the east side of the Court House. We will proceed to Forest Park and from there over to the dam and beach at Morse Reservoir. (Don't forget your swimming suit). This will be an easy hike of 6 to 7 miles. Leader: Vic Knarr (773-3149).
- AUG 22 (Sunday) HOLLIDAY AND MARROTT PARKS - Meet at 2:00 PM in the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple (on Westfield just east of College) for easy to moderate hikes of 4-5 miles and 7-8 miles. Leader: Marsha Hutchins (251-9078).
- AUG 25 (Wednesday) BROAD RIPPLE PARK AREA - Meet in the parking lot of Broad Ripple park, 1450 Broad Ripple avenue, at 10:00 AM for an easy hike of about 4 miles. Leader: Marsha Hutchins (251-9078).
- AUG 29 (Sunday) SHADES STATE PARK - Allow 1-1/2 hours for travel. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Go through Jamestown and take SR 234 west to the Shades State Park. There will be an entrance fee. Follow the road to the right, and park near the shelter house. There will be a moderate hike to and from the backpack and canoe camps starting at 10:00 AM and rugged hikes of 4-5 miles and 8-9 miles starting at 1:30 PM. Leader: Marsha Hutchins (251-9078).
- SEP 4, 5, and 6 LABOR DAY WEEKEND AT BARKLEY STATE PARK - (For members and their invited guests only). The reservation supplement for this event is enclosed with this schedule. For additional information please contact Bill Larrison (359-7538).
- DEADLINE FOR RESERVATIONS: AUGUST 25, 1982
- SEP 6 (Monday) RIVERSIDE PARK AREA - Park in the lot of the Park Department Headquarters at 1426 West 29th street (one-way street east). Meet at 1:00 PM for an easy hike of about 5 miles. Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717).

- SEP 9 (Thursday evening) GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS. - (For members and their invited guests only). Meet at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall of the Covenant Presbyterian Church at 2305 N. Kitley. Park in the rear and enter from the parking lot. DIRECTIONS: Kitley is 6500 east, midway between Arlington and Shadeland on 21st street. Go north on Kitley from 21st to the second church on the right. There will be a short business meeting and then the election of officers. The nominating committee of Mary Pulsifer, Joe Lehman, and Bob Begeman is presenting the following slate of officers for the year beginning October 1, 1982. PRESIDENT: Hazel Morrison VICE-PRESIDENT: Bob McConnell SECRETARY: Rose Damm TREASURER: Gene Waltz PATHFINDER: Marsha Hutchins. DIRECTORS: Frank Thompson, Pat Fox, Shirley Plunkett, and Will Harrer. Further nominations may be made from the floor if properly moved and seconded. All persons nominated from the floor must be present at the meeting. The incoming president will announce the appointed officers. After the election, the program for the evening will be presented by Marsha Hutchins who will show slides from special hiking club trips taken by members this year; BACKPACKING IN THE SMOKIES -- HIKING AND BACKPACKING IN GLACIER PARK -- THE CANOE TRAILS OF THE BOUNDARY WATER CANOE AREA..
- SEP 12 (Sunday) BLUE SPRINGS CAVERN TO PYRAMIDS AT LIMESTONE TOURIST PARK - Allow 2 hours driving time. Take SR 37 south to the junction with US 50 (about 1-1/2 miles south of Bedford). Go west on US 50 approximately 1-1/2 miles to Stumphole Road. Turn right and follow signs to the Blue Springs Cavern. Meet at 10:30 AM for a moderate road hike of 7 or 10 miles to the Pyramids being constructed at Bedford. Bring a trail lunch or plan on buying lunch at a fast food place in Bedford. There will be a shuttle in an army duck. (NOTE: If the weather is cool you may need a jacket in the open air army duck). Leader: Bob Pedigo (783-4071). (NOTE: If Bugs Armstrong does not obtain permission from some private owners, the hike may be changed from the above to something like last year. May not know about this until hike time). After the hike, some may want to take a boat ride in the cave at group rates.
- SEP 18 (Saturday) CANAL HIKE - Meet at 9:00 AM at the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple. We will follow the canal wherever possible to the State Office Building and return to Broad Ripple via the city sidewalks. If a hiker wishes, he or she may ride a bus for the return trip. Bring lunch and water for an easy hike of 8 or 16 miles. Leader: John V. Behrmann (232-1603).
- SEP 19 (Sunday) HOLIDAY LAKE - Allow 1-1/2 hours driving time. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Take SR 234 west from Jamestown to SR 231. Go north on SR 231 for about 2 miles. (From here you can follow small green Lake Holiday signs). Turn left and go west through New Market, cross SR 47, and go 1.4 miles further. Then turn right (north) and go 1 mile to the Lake Holiday office. Meet at 2:00 PM for an easy hike of about 5 miles. Leader: Vic Knarr (773-3149).
- SEP 21 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Use the West 56th Street entrance to the Park. (Just east of the causeway). There will be an entrance fee. Meet in the parking lot on the right side of the road just past the gatehouse at 10:00 AM for an easy hike of 4 miles. Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717).
- SEP 26 (Sunday) FOUR LAKES HIKE - Allow 1-1/2 hours for travel. Take SR 37 to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the State Forest sign, and go about 4 miles to the Morgan-Monroe State Forest entrance. IF YOU ARE GOING ON THE LONGER HIKE OF 14-16 MILES, immediately turn right and go to the parking lot for the Bryant Creek Lake. Meet at 10:00 AM. IF YOU ARE GOING ON THE SHORTER HIKE OF 7 MILES, please leave your passengers at Bryant Creek Lake, and then continue about 2.6 miles on the main forest road to the road for Beanblossom Lake. Turn right and go about a mile to the Beanblossom Lake parking area. Meet at 9:30 AM to be shuttled to the trailhead. (The short hike will end at Beanblossom Lake). All hikers bring water. The long hikers need a trail lunch. Short hikers may leave their lunches in their cars. NOTE: This has become a traditional birthday hike in honor of Ed Chambers, who will be 82 on Sept 25th. Leaders: Ed Chambers and Peggy Franzen (546-3185).

- OCT 2-3 (Saturday and Sunday) BACKPACK IN HOOSIER NATIONAL FOREST - Be sure to contact Libby Moore (852-4717) for reservations and information about this backpack. Allow 2-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to Bloomington. Then follow SR 46 east to the intersection with SR 446. Turn right and go about 12 miles. About 1/2 mile past the Hardin Ridge sign you will come to Tower Road on the left. Turn left and go about a mile on Tower Road to the Horsemen's Camp. Meet there at 11:00 AM on Saturday.
- OCT 3 (Sunday) JACKSON STATE FOREST - Allow 2 hours driving time from the south side of Indianapolis. Take I-65 south to the Seymour exit of U.S. 50 west. Go west on US 50 through Seymour to Brownstown. Take SR 250 south (left) about 3 miles to Jackson State Forest entrance on the left. Assemble in the parking lot beyond the lake at 11:00 for 4 to 5 miles and 10 to 11 miles of moderate to rugged hiking. The longer hike will have a series of very steep hills. Those taking the longer hike should bring a trail lunch and drinking water. Leader: Bill Larrison (359 7538)
