MIDWEEK EVENING SET-YOUR-OWN-PACE WALKS. Upon request, we will continue these hikes through October. However, we will change the location back to the Northside and move up the starting time. SEE BELOW FOR MORE DETAILS.

- OCT 5 (Wednesday Evening) RIVERVIEW HIKE - Sign in in the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple (on Westfield just east of College Ave.) between 5:15 and 5:30 PM for easy self-guided hikes of 5 or 8 miles. (Persons wishing to hike but unable to arrive until after the designated starting time should contact the leader to make arrangements). Leader: Marsha Hutchins (251-9078).
- OCT 8 (Saturday) CROOKED CREEK - WRECKER HIKE - Allow about 2 hours travel time. From Nashville go west on SR 46. Continue west for 2.7 miles past the west entrance to Brown County State Park. Look for a group of buildings on the north side of the highway - 2 trailers, a log house, a small house, and a white building that was formerly a church. Just past these buildings is a green road sign saying "Bloomington", and "Nashville". Turn south on a gravel road just opposite this area and go 2.7 miles to the Crooked Creek Lake parking area on the left. Meet at 9:00 AM for a moderate hike of approximately 13 miles. Bring lunch and water. Leaders: Robert and Marjorie Begeman (359-4174).
- OCT 9 (Sunday) SPEEDWAY LEVEE HIKE - Take route of your choice to the 6200 block of West Tenth Street. This is just east of I-465. Go north on Vinewood Drive one half block to High School Road. Turn left and follow High School Road to Westwood Country Club. Easy hike of about 5 miles to start at 2:00 PM. Leaders: Odie & Phyllis Cassetty. (244-9913).
- OCT 12 (Wednesday Evening) RIVERVIEW HIKE - (Same instructions as for Oct 5)
- OCT 15 (Saturday) MORSE RESERVOIR - CICERO - Meet in Noblesville at the Noblesville Square Shopping Center which is three-fourths of a mile west of the Courthouse on SR 32. A moderate 17 mile self-guided road hike will start at 8:30 AM. Bring trail lunch and water. Leader: Rose Damm (773-0143).
- OCT 16 (Sunday) WASHINGTON BOULEVARD - CENTRAL AVENUE HIKE - Meet in the St. Joan of Arc school playground just off 42nd Street between Central and College Avenues. Meet before 12:00 Noon. There will a 15 minute pipe organ recital played by Norma Huber in the church followed immediately by a sidewalk hike of 5 and 10 miles. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791).
- OCT 18 (Tuesday) CROWN HILL CEMETERY - Enter through the gate on Clarendon Road just north of 38th Street. Park behind the Mausoleum. Easy hike of 4 miles will start at 9:30 AM. Leader: Dorothy Field (253-7114).

- OCT 19 (Wednesday Evening). RIVERVIEW HIKE - (Same instructions as for Oct 5).
- OCT 22 & 23 (Saturday & Sunday) FALL OVERNIGHT AT NEW HARMONY - (For members and their invited guests only). The reservation supplement for this event was previously mailed to the members. Please consult it for details. We are pushing up the deadline for reservations a couple of days, because we have to forward our rooming assignments two weeks ahead of time. Also we need to know by then if we have to cancel any rooms. If you need additional information please contact either Bill Larrison (359-7538) or Hazel Morrison (356-7681). We urge all of you who are coming to this overnight, to plan to arrive by noon in order to take part in the afternoon tour we have arranged of Historic New Harmony.

DEADLINE FOR RESERVATIONS: OCTOBER 6, 1983

- OCT 23 (Sunday) ZIONSVILLE HIKE - Exit I-465 at SR 421 north (at the Pyramids) and go north 2-1/4 miles to the Zionsville turnoff. Turn left and go west one mile to the Lions Club Park entrance on the right. Assemble at 2:00 PM for an easy hike of 7 to 8 miles through the village and countryside. Leader: Paul Anuta (1-463-5086).
- OCT 26 (Wednesday Evening) RIVERVIEW HIKE - (Same instructions as for Oct 5).
- OCT 29 (Saturday) WEST SIDE OF EAGLE CREEK RESERVOIR - Take West 56th Street to the Eagle Creek Reservoir and assemble in the lot that is just west of the causeway. Meet at 1:00 PM for a moderate to rugged hike of 5 miles. Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717).
- OCT 30 (Sunday) NORTHWOOD HIKE - Meet at 1:00 PM in the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple for an easy hike of 10 to 11 miles mostly on streets and sidewalks. Leader: Marsha Hutchins (251-9078).
- NOV 1 (Tuesday) CHRISTIAN PARK TO GARFIELD PARK - Meet at the Christian Park Community Center (4200 English Avenue) at 9:30 AM for an easy 8 mile hike. Leader: Marge Begeman (359-4174).
- NOV 5 (Saturday) OLD YELLOW TRACE - Allow 1-1/2 hours for travel. Take SR 37 south to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the sign for Morgan-Monroe State Forest and go about 4 miles to the forest entrance. Turn left and continue about 4 miles to the old Tulip Tree Trace parking area on the right side of the road. This is about one mile before the fire tower. Meet at 8:30 AM for a rugged hike of 18 to 20 miles. Leader: George Newhall (823-6534).
- NOV 6 (Sunday) GNAW BONE CAMP - Allow about 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 135 south to Nashville. Turn left on SR 46 and go a couple of miles past the north Brown County Park entrance to where SR 135 turns south (right). Take SR 135 south about 2 miles to the entrance to Gnow Bone Camp. Assemble at 9:30 AM for morning section of about 7 miles. The afternoon section will start about 1:00 PM, and will be about 5 or 6 miles. Total mileage of about 12 to 13 miles. Those taking both sections should bring a trail lunch and water, which we will eat in the shelter house between the two hikes. Moderate to rugged - some hills. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538). (NOTE: \$1.00 per person fee on this hike)
- NOV 9 (Wednesday) GUIDED TOUR OF INDIANA STATE MUSEUM AND DOWNTOWN HIKE - Park in the museum parking lot at 202 North Alabama. Tour will start at 1:30 PM. A slow and easy hike of 2 miles will follow the tour. Leader: Alberta Neill (634-7672).

- NOV 10 (Thursday) GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND CLUB SOCIAL - (For members and their invited guests only). Meet at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall of the Covenant Presbyterian Church at 2305 N. Kitley. (Park in the rear and enter from the parking lot). DIRECTIONS: Kitley is 6500 east, between Arlington and Shadeland north of 21st street. Go north on Kitley from 21st to the second church on the right. There will be a business meeting followed by the program for the evening. We are pleased to present one of our members, Phil Lin. who will tell us about his recent trip to mainland China as he shows slides taken by him during his stay there. Phil visited his old home town, and many places he knew when he lived there.
- NOV 12 (Saturday) BEARS OF BLUE RIVER TRAIL - Take I-74 southeast approximately 25 miles to SR 9. Turn left (north) on SR 9 and drive one block to Morristown Road. Turn right and go 1/2 mile to WSVL radio station on the right. Allow one hour of driving time. Hike will start promptly at 9:00 AM due to car shuttle. Bring trail lunch and liquid for moderate 14 mile hike. Patch available. Leader: John Behrmann (232-1603).
- NOV 13 (Sunday) SOUTHEASTWAY PARK - Allow 3/4 hour travel time from downtown. Take I-74 southeast to the Pleasant View Exit. Turn left and go into town. Turn left at the "T" and go 0.7 miles to county line road. Go north on county line road a little over a mile to the park entrance on the left. Assemble in the parking area near Shelter # 1 for an easy hike of about 5 miles starting at 1:30 PM, and going through the park and along nearby county roads. Leaders: Win & Mary Pulsifer (784-1835).
- NOV 19 (Saturday) OLD NATIONAL ROAD HIKE - HUDDLESTON FARMHOUSE INN MUSEUM TOUR - Meet at the Huddleston Museum parking area located 60 miles east of downtown Indianapolis on US 40 in Mt. Auburn. The Museum is 0.4 miles from the Mt. Auburn sign on the south side of US 40. Approximately 1/2 hour guided tour of the Museum, which is a property of Historic Landmarks Foundation of Indiana, will start promptly at 10:00 AM to be followed by walks of 4, 10, or 12 miles through Dublin, Mt. Auburn, Cambridge City, and East Germantown along the route of historic homes, buildings, and landmarks. Those walking 10 or 12 miles should bring lunch and water. A \$1.00 donation to the Museum is suggested. Leader: Rose Damm (773-0143).
- NOV 20 (Sunday) CROSLEY STATE FISH & WILDLIFE AREA - Take I-65 south to SR 46 near Columbus. Go east to SR 7. Then go southeast to North Vernon. The Fish and Wildlife area is 5 miles south of North Vernon on SR 3. Allow 1-1/2 hours driving time from the south side of Indianapolis. Meet in the parking lot at the entrance at 9:00 AM for moderate to rugged hikes of 9, 12, and 15 miles on roads (mostly gravel) and trails. Bring lunch and water. Leader: Al Drehobl (898-3632).
- NOV 25, 26, and 27 (Friday through Sunday) BACKPACK IN RED RIVER GORGE - KENTUCKY - Be sure to contact Jim Jones (253-4834) for reservations and information about this very rugged backpack of about 25 miles. Allow about 6 hours for this trip of 240 miles. Take I-65 south to Louisville, and go east on I-64 to the Mountain Parkway Toll Road. Take the Toll Road to the Beattyville Exit. This is at the 40 mile marker and is also marked for Kentucky highways 715 and 15. Turn right on Kentucky 15 and proceed 3 miles to the Koomer Ridge Campground. At the campground, use the hiker parking lot on the left side of the road. The sign is by the forest service house trailer. Meet at 12:00 Noon on Friday. Leader: Jim Jones (253-4834).
- NOV 26 (Saturday) EASTSIDE ROAD HIKE - Meet in the parking area of Cherry Tree Shoppes southwest of Washington Square at Washington Street and Mitthoefer Road. Meet at 8:30 AM for a 10 to 12 mile hike on back roads. Leader: Ursula Breeding (359-8686).

- NOV 27 (Sunday) PURDUE UNIVERSITY - Allow 2 hours for travel. Take I-65 north to Road 25 exit at Lafayette. Go west toward town 1-1/2 miles to Sagamore Parkway (the first light). Turn right and go 3 miles to Yeager Road in West Lafayette (third traffic light). Turn left and go 1/4 mile to Northwestern Avenue. Turn left and go 1-1/2 miles south to the entrance of Purdue Engineering Mall in front of the fountain. Turn right into the campus and park along either side of the mall. Assemble at 2:00 PM for an easy to moderate 5 mile hike around the campus area. Leader: Paul Anuta (1-463-5086).
- NOV 29 (Tuesday) GEIST RESERVOIR - Go northeast on Fall Creek Road to 1/4 mile past the the Sailing Club. Park on the north end of the causeway along the side of the road. Meet at 9:30 AM for a moderate 6 mile hike. Leader: Marjorie Begeman (359-4174).
- DEC 3 (Saturday) ANNUAL CHRISTMAS PARTY - (For members and their invited guests only)
PLACE: Covenant Presbyterian Church at 2305 N. Kitley. DIRECTIONS: Kitley is 6500 east, between Arlington and Shadeland. Go north on Kitley from 21st street to the second church on the right. (Park in the rear and enter from the parking lot.)
ARRIVAL TIME: 6:00 PM. Our old-fashioned pitch-in dinner to start at 6:30 PM. Bring food to contribute according to the size of your family group - enough for hearty appetites. An entree, or a covered dish, or perhaps some dessert, or snacks - we'll mix it together on the buffet table. Bring your own plates and silverware.
