SPECIAL NOTE: Opportunity to Camp and Hike with the Club the last weekend in September at Morgan-Monroe State Forest. Camping Friday and Saturday nights at Drapers cabin, a primitive log cabin with no facilities. Limit of 14 people at this site. A fee of \$2.00 per person will cover both nights. For reservations call Ron Craig (255-6215). (Overflow site will be at the fire tower camping area).

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- AUG 8 (Wednesday) RIVERVIEW HIKE Sign in at the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple on Westfield just east of College, between 5:15 and 5:30 PM for easy, self-guided hikes of 5 or 8 miles. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791). This hike will be repeated every Wednesday during August.
- AUG 9 (Thursday) GLENDAL-ORCHARD-VIEW NEIGHBORHOODS - Meet at the south end of the Glendale parking lot on the east side of Rural Street for easy 4 mile hike starting at 9:30 AM. Leader: Dorothy Field (253-7114).
- AUG 11 (Saturday) SPEEDWAY TO THATCHER - Meet in the parking lot near the Marsh Supermarket, 5900 Crawfordsville Road (SR 136) for easy 7 to 8 mile hike starting at 8:00 AM. Leaders: Wilma and Frank Thompson (241-7154).
- AUG 12 (Sunday) SHADES STATE PARK - Allow 1-1/2 hours driving time. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Go through Jamestown and take SR 234 west to the Shades State Park. There will be an entrance fee. Follow the road to the left and park in the picnic parking area. There will be a moderate hike of about 6 to 7 miles exploring the ravines and woods of Shades. We may possibly walk to the Pine Hills Nature preserve or to the canoe camp if time and mileage permits. Assemble at 2:00 PM. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538).
- AUG 15 (Wednesday) RIVERVIEW HIKE - See instructions for August 8th.
- AUG 18 (Saturday) CLIFTY FALLS STATE PARK - Take I-65 south to Seymour exit 49. Take US 50 east to SR 7 at North Vernon, and go south to the north Park Entrance (Fee charged) Drive through the park for approximately 4 miles and meet in the Clifty Inn parking lot for moderate to rugged hikes of about 6 and 9 miles starting at 9:00 AM. Bring trail lunch and liquid. Allow 2 hours travel time. Leader: Tom Palmberg (923-6990).
- AUG 19 (Sunday) FRANKLIN - Take I-65 south to SR 44 west. Turn left onto Forsyth, continue past Franklin College to Park Avenue. Turn right and park in the first parking lot on the right. This easy hike of 3 to 4 miles will start at 9:00 AM. Leader: Hugh Weber (1-933-3237).
- AUG 22 (Wednesday) RIVERVIEW HIKE - See instructions for August 8th.
- AUG 23 (Thursday) UNION CHAPEL AND EAST 80TH STREET NEIGHBORHOODS - Meet at parking lot across road from Colonial Hills Baptist Church, 8151 Union Chapel Road. Hike to start at 9:00 AM. 5 miles, easy. Leader: Dorothy Field (253-7114).
- AUG 25 (Saturday) WOODRUFF PLACE AND ARSENAL TECHNICAL HIGH SCHOOL - Park in the southwest corner of the Kroger parking lot at the 1800 block of East 10th. Meet at 2:00 PM for a slow & easy hike of 3 to 4 miles. Leader: Alberta Neill (634-7672).

AUG 26 (Sunday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the sign for Morgan-Monroe State Forest. Go about 4 miles to the forest entrance. Turn left and drive to the fire tower parking lot for a moderate hike of 5 to 7 miles. Hike to start at 10:00 AM. Leader: Ed Chambers (244-4554).

AUG 29 (Wednesday) RIVERVIEW HIKE - See instructions for August 8th.

SEP 1 (Saturday) RILEY TRAIL OF INDIANAPOLIS - Meet at the State House Parking lot located on the south side of Ohio Street at 8:30 AM for a 20 mile moderate hike visiting the historical landmarks of the city. Trail lunch and liquid or purchase lunch along the way. Leader: John V. Behrmann (462-7058). Shorter hikes may be arranged by calling the leader. You will have to provide your own transportation back to the starting point.

SEP 1, 2, and 3 (Saturday through Monday) LABOR DAY WEEKEND AT SALT FORK STATE PARK. - (For Members and their invited guests only). The reservation supplement was previously mailed to the members. For additional information, please contact Bill Larrison (359-7538). Charlie Brunette has scouted the area recently and is leading hikes on Saturday and Sunday. Details will be in the schedule of events passed out at Salt Fork. Driving time is 5 or more hours. We urge everyone attending to try to arrive about noon in order to take part in all the activities.

SEP 5 (Wednesday) RIVERVIEW HIKE - Sign in at the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple on Westfield just east of College between 5:15 and 5:30 PM for easy self-guided hikes of 5 or 8 miles. Leader: Carol Sutcliffe (283-4409). This hike will be repeated every Wednesday in September.

SEP 8 (Saturday) LOGANSPOUT-WABASH RIVER - From Kokomo go north on US 35 ^{Bypass} west of Logansport. Turn east onto US 24 toward town. Go 1/2 mile and park in the lot near a Hook's Drug Store on the north side of US 24. Allow 1-3/4 hours travel time. Meet at 9:30 AM for a 15 mile road hike along the Wabash River and the city. Trail lunch and water. Leaders: Marge & Bob Begeman (359-4174).

SEP 9 (Sunday) MAROTT PARK, TOW PATH & THE ART MUSEUM - Meet in the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple on Westfield just east of College at 7:00 AM for a moderate hike of 10 to 12 miles. Leader: Ursula Breeding (359-8686).

SEP 12 (Wednesday) RIVERVIEW HIKE - See instructions for September 5th.

SEP 13 (Thursday) GENERAL ASSEMBLY - ELECTION OF OFFICERS - (For members and their invited guests only). Meet at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall of the Covenant Presbyterian church at 2305 N. Kitley. (Park in the rear and enter from the parking lot). DIRECTIONS: Kitley is 6500 east, between Arlington and Shadeland on 21st street. Go north on Kitley from 21st to the second church on the right. The nominating committee consisting of Tom Patterson, chairman, and Carol Sutcliffe, and Frank Thompson is presenting the following slate of candidates for office. PRESIDENT: Sam Lloyd VICE-PRESIDENT: Will Harrer and Bob Begeman SECRETARY: Dorothy Field and Jill Harmon TREASURER: Betty Woodward and Ron Craig. PATHFINDER: Charles Brunette and Harrison Feldman DIRECTORS: Linda Elliott, Ursula Breeding, Tom Palmberg, Al Drehobl, Philip Lin, and Dennis Taft. The voting for the five line offices will be done separately, and the defeated candidates will automatically be considered as nominees for the office of Director before the balloting for the Directors commences. Further nominations from the floor may be made by the members if properly moved and seconded. All persons nominated from the floor must be present at the meeting. Following the elections, John Williams will present a slide show about Australia, and the Earth Watch program there.

- SEP 15 (Saturday) NOBSTONE TRAIL - (Jackson Road Trailhead to New Chapel Trailhead) Allow 2-1/4 hours travel time. Go south on I-65 to the Henryville exit. Go west on SR 160 for 5.6 miles. Turn right on New Chapel Road. Go north 1/2 mile to the New Chapel Trailhead parking area on the right. Meet at 10:00 AM. BE PROMPT DUE TO CAR SHUTTLE. Bring trail lunch and liquid for a rugged 14 mile hike. Suggested pit stop is the Henryville rest stop on I-65. Leader: Al Drehobl (898-3632).
- SEP 15 (Saturday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - Follow same directions as for the August 26 hike. Assemble at 11:00 AM for a 5 mile slow and easy hike. Leaders: Juanita Lauth (353-6325) and Alberta Neill.
- SEP 16 (Sunday) KOKOMO HISTORICAL HIKE - Allow 1-3/4 hours travel time. Go north on US 31. Take the By-Pass in Kokomo, not the business route. Turn right at the McDonald's in Markland Mall onto SR 22 and 35. DO NOT TURN at the McDonald's on the south side of town. Go about 3 miles and watch for the Wildcat Creek Reservoir sign at County Road 500 E. Turn left (north) and go one mile to Wildcat Creek Reservoir. Park on the left side of the road just before the Reservoir. Moderate hikes of 7 and 13 miles. A shuttle will leave promptly at 9:00 AM. Trail lunch and liquid for the longer hike. Leader: Robin Ott (1-453-0579).
- SEP 19 (Wednesday) RIVERVIEW HIKE - See instructions for September 5th.
- SEP 22 (Saturday) FLATROCK RIVER - Allow one hour travel time for this 10 to 12 mile moderate hike. Take I-74 east to the Middletown - St. Paul exit. Follow signs to the Flat Rock YMCA Camp. Assemble at 9:00 AM. Bring trail lunch and liquid. Leaders: Carol Sutcliffe (283-4409) and Michelle Goodrich.
- SEP 23 (Sunday) FOUR LAKES - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the State Forest sign, and go about 4 miles to the forest entrance. IF YOU ARE GOING ON THE LONGER HIKE (14 to 16 miles) turn right and go to the parking lot for Bryant Creek. IF YOU ARE GOING ON THE SHORTER HIKE (8 miles) please drop your passengers at Bryant Creek Lake, and then continue about 2.6 miles on the main forest road to the road for Beanblossom Lake. Turn right and go about a mile to the Beanblossom Lake parking area. BE THERE BY 9:40 AM to be shuttled back to the Bryant Creek lake where the hikes will start at 10:00 AM. The short hike will end at Beanblossom Lake. Short hikers bring liquid, but can leave their lunches in their cars. Long hikers carry liquid and lunch, to be eaten at Beanblossom after the short hike. NOTE: This has become a traditional birthday hike in honor of Ed Chambers who will be 84 on Tuesday, the 25th. Leaders: Ed Chambers and Peggy Franzen (546-3185).
- SEP 26 (Wednesday) RIVERVIEW HIKE - See instructions for September 5th.
- SEP 29 (Saturday) POSSUM TROT WINERY - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Same directions as for the August 26th Hike. Meet at 9:30 AM at the fire tower for a moderate to rugged hike of 15 miles. Trail lunch and water. Leaders: George Newhall & Ron Craig (255-6215)
- SEP 29 (Saturday) FORT HARRISON - Meet at 9:00 AM on the west side of the Finance Center for a 6 mile Volksmarch, near the tent Food and entertainment available. Leader: Siglinde Moore (243-0510).
- SEP 30 (Sunday) GOSE CREEK - Same directions as for the August 26th hike. Assemble at 9:30 AM for a moderate to rugged hike of 14 miles. Leaders: Peggy Franzen & Ron Craig (255-6215).
- Oct 2 (Tuesday) ELLENBERGER PARK - Meet between 5:15 and 5:30 PM in the parking lot near the swimming pool and the ice rink, 5400 block of East St. Clair for self-guided hikes of 4, 6, and 8 miles. Leader: Ursula Breeding (359-8686). This hike will be repeated every Tuesday in October.

OCT 6 and 7 (Saturday and Sunday) BACKPACK IN HOOSIER NATIONAL FOREST - Be sure to contact Libby Moore (852-4717) for reservations and information about this backpack. Take SR 37 south to Bloomington. Then follow SR 46 east to the intersection with SR 446. Turn right and go about 12 miles. About 1/2 mile past the Hardin Ridge sign you will come to Tower Road on the left. Turn left and go about a mile on Tower Road to the Horseman Camp. Meet there at 11:00 AM on Saturday. NOTE: DO NOT PUT THIS IN PAPERS.

OCT 9 (Tuesday) ELLENBERGER PARK - See instructions for October 2nd.

OCT 13 (Saturday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE PARK - Follow same instructions for September 23rd to meet at the Bryant Creek Lake parking lot. Assemble at 10:00 AM for a moderate hike of 5 to 7 miles. Leader: Ed Chambers (244-4554).

OCT 14 (Sunday) WASHINGTON BLVD - BUTLER HOLCOMB GARDENS - Meet in the St. Joan of Arc school playground just off 42nd street between Central and College avenues at 11:45 AM. There will be a 15 minute pipe organ recital played by Norma Huber in the church before hikes of 4, 7, and 12 miles. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791).
