27 YEARS OF SPONSORING OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES IN THE FORM OF HIKES AND OUTINGS

- OCT 16 (Tuesday) ELLENBERGER PARK - Meet between 5:15 and 5:30 PM in the parking lot near the swimming pool, 5400 block of East St. Clair for self-guided hikes of 4, 6, and 8 miles Leader: Ursula Breeding (359-8686). To be repeated Tuesdays in October.
- OCT 17 (Wednesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Assemble just inside the main entrance of the park off of West 56th Street at 10:00 AM for an easy hike of 5 miles Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439)
- OCT 20 (Saturday) JACKSON STATE FOREST - About 2 hours travel time. Take I-65 south to the Seymour exit, US 50 West Go west on US 50 to Brownstown. Take SR 250 left about 3 miles to the Jackson State Forest entrance on the left. Assemble in the parking lot beyond the lake at 10:30 AM for moderate to rugged hikes of 5 and 13 miles. The longer hike has a series of very steep hills. Those taking the longer hike should bring a trail lunch and water. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538).
- OCT 21 (Sunday) A. GLENDALE TO CIRCLE - There will be hikes of 9 miles and 18 to 19 miles. Assemble at the Glendale shopping center on the east side of Rural Street at 8:00 AM. Bring trail lunch and water for picnic in University Park. Hikers going one way only are responsible for arranging their own transportation back to their cars. Leader: Tom Patterson (849-9528).
B. PRINCE'S LAKES - Take SR 135 south to SR 252 just south of Trafalger. Turn east (left) and take SR 252 about 4 miles to Nineveh. Turn right and drive 3-1/2 miles to Nineveh. After Nineveh continue on same road (curvy) to a business corner (about 1-1/2 miles), and turn right and go about 3/4 mile to Prince's Lakes Town Hall. Park there in the parking lot. The hike will start at 11:00 AM. This will be an easy 5 mile road hike in the lake country. Leader: Hugh Weber
- OCT 23 (Tuesday) ELLENBERGER PARK - See instructions for October 16, 1984
- OCT 24 (Wednesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - See instructions for October 17, 1984
- OCT 27 (Saturday) A. FLOWING WELL - Meet at 9:30 AM near building 10 at Keystone at the Crossing Shopping Center on 86th Street just east of Keystone Ave. for an easy 12 mile road hike Bring lunch and water. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791).
B. VILLAGE FARMS - Take US 31 north to 161st Street. Turn left and go 500 feet to Farr Hill Drive. Turn left and park on the street. Meet at 2:00 PM for an easy hike of 5 miles Leader: George MacLean (896-5769).
- OCT 28 (Sunday) A. METAMORA-OLDENBURG "TOBACCO ROAD" - Take US 52 east. Turn right after crossing bridge over west fork of the Whitewater River to first lot on right in historic Metamora Village. Allow 1-3/4 hours travel time. Vigorous road hikes of 11 and 21 miles. Those taking the 11 mile hike should meet at 8:15 AM for car shuttle Those taking the 21 mile hike should be at the Metamora lot at 8:45 AM. Bring trail lunch and water Leader: Tom Palmberg (923-6990).
B. ELLENBERGER PARK - Meet at 1:00 PM in the parking lot near the swimming pool at Ellenberger Park, 5400 block of East St. Clair St. for a 3 or 7 mile hike. Leader: Betty Woodward (545-4480).

OCT 30 (Tuesday) ELLENBERGER PARK - See instructions for October 16, 1984

NOV 3 (Saturday) GNAW BONE CAMP - About 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 135 south to Nashville. Turn left on SR 46 and go a couple of miles past the north Brown County State Park entrance to where SR 135 turns right (south). Go south on 135 a couple of miles to the Gnaw Bone Camp entrance on the left. Assemble at 9:30 AM for the morning hike of 6 to 7 miles. The afternoon hike will start about 1:00 PM and will also be 6 to 7 miles. Those taking both hikes should bring trail lunch and water. Moderate to rugged - some hills. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538).

NOV 4 (Sunday) A. ORIENTEERING - Allow 2 hours travel time. Go south on SR 446 (east of Bloomington) across the causeway and 1 mile past the Hardin Ridge turn-off. Go to the gravel road (Tower road) which is just past the Maumee Boy Scout sign. Turn left on Tower road for 1/2 mile, then right to the Blackwell Lake parking area. Each hiker should have a pencil, scrap paper, compass and both the Allens Creek and the Elkinsville 7.5 min topographical maps. Maps are available at the State Office Building Map Room. Meet at 9:30 AM. Bring trail lunch and liquid. Mileage to be determined after the hiking (probably around 10 to 12 miles). Leader: Bob Begeman (359-4174).

B. FALL CREEK - Meet at 1:00 PM on the parking lot at Windridge Shopping Center located at Fall Creek and Emerson Way for a 5 or 8 mile hike. Leader: Betty Woodward (545-4480).

NOV 6 (Tuesday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the sign for Morgan-Monroe State Forest. Go about 4 miles to the forest entrance. Turn left and drive to the fire tower parking lot for a moderate hike of 5 to 7 miles. Hike to start at 9:30 AM. Leader: Bill Flora (898-0760). This hike will be repeated every Tuesday morning during November.

NOV 8 (Thursday) GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND CLUB SOCIAL - (For members and their invited guests) Meet at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall of the Covenant Presbyterian Church at 2305 N. Kitley (Park in the rear and enter from the parking lot). DIRECTIONS: Kitley is 6500 east, between Arlington and Shadeland. Go north on Kitley from 21st street to the second church on the right. There will be a business meeting. Following the meeting, Ron Craig will give an illustrated talk on the canoe areas in Maine, and in Quetico, Canada. Refreshments will be served.

NOV 10 (Saturday) MORSE RESERVOIR - CICERO - Meet in Noblesville at the Noblesville Square Shopping Center which is 3/4 mile west of the Courthouse on SR 32. Moderate self-guided road hikes of 6, 12, and 16 miles will start at 9:00 AM. Bring trail lunch and water. Leader: Rose Damm (773-0143).

NOV 11 (Sunday) BLOOMFIELD BRICK - Meet at 9:00 AM for a 16 mile road hike. Bring lunch and water. Meet on the west side of Bloomfield Courthouse (in the center of town). Take SR 67 south. State roads 67 and 231 join just north of Spencer. Continue on these routes to barely south of Washington where you follow 231 as it turns south to Bloomfield. Travel time - about 1-3/4 hours. Leader: Bob Begeman (359-4174).

(B.) WHITE RIVER AND CANAL - Meet in the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple on Westfield Blvd., just east of College ave. at 2:00 PM for easy hikes of 4 and 6 miles. Leader: George MacLean (896-5769).

NOV 13 (Tuesday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - See instructions for November 6, 1984

NOV 17 (Saturday) A. POTATO CREEK STATE PARK - Moderate hikes of 7, 12, and 17 miles. Take US 31 north to SR 4. Turn west and drive 4 miles to the entrance of State Park. After passing main gate (entrance fee), turn left at "T" intersection. Turn right at first road and proceed past bicycle trail. Turn left at road leading to Tulip-Poplar Picnic area. Meet at 9:30 AM. Allow 3 hours travel time. Bring trail lunch and liquid. Leader: John Behrmann (462-7058).

- NOV 17 (Saturday) B. SOUTHEASTWAY PARK - Go east on I-74 to the Pleasant View exit. Turn left (west) at the road in town and go past the bank to County Line Road. Turn right and go the park, and park in the parking lot there. Hike to start at 2:00 PM 3 to 4 miles slow and easy. Leaders: Dora Buehler and Alberta Neill (634-7672).

- NOV 18 (Sunday) DEAM WILDERNESS - Assemble at 9:30 for a moderate to rugged 15 mile hike. Allow 2-1/4 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to SR 46. Go east through Bloomington and turn right onto SR 446. Cross the Monroe Reservoir causeway and go 4.3 miles further. Turn left at the road just past the Maumee Boy Scout Reservation sign. Go about 6 miles to the fire tower parking lot. Bring trail lunch and liquid. Leader: Al Drehobl (898-3632).
(B.) TRAFALGAR - Assemble at 12:30 PM at Indian Creek High School for an 8 mile road hike. Take SR 135 south to Trafalgar. The High School is located at the junction of SR 135 and SR 252. Leaders: Pat Fox and Shirley Plunkett (897-8247).
- NOV 20 (Tuesday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - See instructions for November 6, 1984.

- NOV 24 (Saturday). COLUMBUS ARCHITECTURAL TOUR - Columbus is nationally known for its architecture. Take I-65 south to the second Columbus exit (SR 46). Go east on SR 46 and after crossing the bridge, veer to the right onto Second Street (one way east). Go a few blocks and turn left onto Franklin (one way north). Assemble at 9:00 AM in the parking lot behind the Visitor Center. The entrance to the lot is on the right side north of Fifth Street. We will watch a 20 minute slide presentation and then go on a 10 to 12 mile hike. Bring trail lunch and liquid. Leader: Jim Ernsting (283-4409).
(B) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - See instructions for November 6, 1984
- NOV 25 (Sunday) MCCORMICK'S CREEK STATE PARK - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 67 south to Spencer. Turn east on SR 46 and go a few miles to the park entrance (entrance fee). Assemble in the parking area near the nature center at 1:00 PM for a 5 to 6 mile moderate hike. Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).
- NOV 27 (Tuesday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - See instructions for November 6, 1984
- DEC 1 (Saturday) A. MEMORIAL PARK - Meet at 1:00 PM for a 10 to 11 mile country road hike. Take I-70 east to the New Castle exit, SR 3. Turn left onto SR 3 and follow it through the city. Look for a wooden sign on the right reading "MEMORIAL PARK". Turn left into entrance. Go 3/10 mile and park in a picnic space on the right. There will be a small sign there reading "tennis". There are no restroom facilities at the park. Allow 1 hour driving time from east side of Indianapolis. Leader: Betty Woodward (545-4480).
B. TOUR OF HOOSIER DOME - Meet at the doors of the Hoosier Dome on Capitol avenue just south of the ticket office at 1:45 PM. Tour starts at 2.00 PM. Prices are Adults \$2.00, Senior Citizens and Students \$1.50, Children 75¢ and children under 6 free. (If we have 20 or more, prices will be Adults \$1.50, Senior Citizens and Students \$1.00, Children 50¢ and children under 6 free. After the tour there will be a slow and easy hike downtown of 2 miles. (In case the tour is unavailable, there will be a longer hike). Leader: Alberta Neill (634-7672).
- DEC 2 (Sunday) ELLENBERGER PARK - Use directions for October 28, 1984. Two hikes from this location. Meet at 9:00 AM for a 10 mile self-guided road hike. Leader: Charlie Brunette (542-7846). Also meet at 2:00 PM for a 4 mile hike. Leader: George MacLean (896-5769).
