- OCT 8 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at 10:00 AM at the parking lot at the entrance off 56th street for an easy 5 to 6 mile hike. This hike will be repeated alternately by Libby Moore and Mary Kidwell throughout the month October. Leaders: Libby Moore (852-4717) and Mary Kidwell (852-2439).
- OCT 9 (Wednesday) SOUTH GROVE - RIVERSIDE HIKE - Meet at 18th street and Riverside Drive at the Southgrove golf course parking area for a self-guided hike of either 4 or 5 miles. Sign in between 5:00 PM and 5:30 PM. This hike will be repeated each Wednesday evening through the month of October. Leaders: Frank & Wilma Thompson (241-7154).
- OCT 12 (Saturday) CAMP PALAWOPEC HIKE - Allow over 1-1/2 hours from Indianapolis. Take SR 135 south to Nashville. Turn left at first traffic light, and take old SR 46 a couple of miles to Clay Lick road. Turn left and go past the C.Y.O. camp until you come to the entrance to Camp Palawopec on the right. There will be a \$1.00 per person fee. There will be a six mile hike starting at 9:00 AM and a 4 to 5 mile hike starting at 1:30 PM. You can take either one or both. Bring lunch and water if you plan on taking both hikes. Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).
- OCT 13 (Sunday) MERIDIAN - KESSLER NEIGHBORHOOD - Meet in the St. Joan of Arc school playground just off 42nd St. between Central and College avenues at 11:45 A.M. There will be a 15 minute pipe organ recital played by Normal Huber in the church before the hikes of 4, 7, and 12 miles. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791).
- OCT 15 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - See instructions for October 8th.
- OCT 16 (Wednesday) SOUTH GROVE - RIVERSIDE PARK - See instructions for October 9th.
- OCT 19 (Saturday) ORANGEVILLE RISE OF THE LOST RIVER - Meet at 1:00 PM for an easy 12 mile road hike exploring the Lost River area around Orangeville. Allow approximately 2-3/4 hours driving time. Take SR 37 south to Paoli. Turn west on US 150 and travel approximately 6 miles to the Ames Chapel United Methodist Church on the right (north of 150). Park in the church lot. For those interested in staying overnight for the Hemlock Cliff hike, there is a dry (no water) campground at Hemlock Cliffs. Leader: Robert Begeman (359-4174).

OCT 20 (Sunday) (A) HEMLOCK CLIFFS - Allow approximately 3 hours travel time. Meet at 9:30 AM for a 10 mile scenic forest hike. Go south on SR 37 to the Grantsburg by-pass and continue south on SR 37 through Grantsburg to the Blue River. The Blue River is not marked. The bridge is a low concrete affair 1/2 mile south of Grantsburg. Turn right (west) on Union Chapel road (might not be marked) which is the first road one mile south of the Blue River. The Union Chapel road will be found just before the end of the new SR 37 road. If you go to Interstate 64, turn around and go back north. Go 2.6 mile on the Union Chapel Road to a fork in the road. Keep right on gravel road for 3.4 miles to second "Y". Hemlock Cliffs sign should be posted here. Keep right on small paved road to parking lot (old picnic area) at Hemlock Cliffs. Leaders: Robert and Marjorie Begeman (359-4174).

(B) CRAWFORDSVILLE WALKING TOUR - Take I-74 west to SR 32 and turn west to Crawfordsville. Follow SR 32 through town, turning left onto Washington St., then go about .4 of a mile to College St. Turn left and go about .5 of a mile to Mill St. Turn right to Milligan Park entrance on the left. Meet at first parking space on the right for a 7 mile hike starting at 1:00 PM. Includes a visit to one of two historical sites (modest admission fees). Allow 1-1/2 hours driving time. Leader: Dorothy Field (253-7114).

OCT 23 (Wednesday) SOUTH GROVE - RIVERSIDE PARK - See instructions for October 9th.

OCT 29 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - See instructions for October 8th.

OCT 30 (Wednesday) SOUTH GROVE - RIVERSIDE PARK - See instructions for October 9th.

NOV 1 (Friday) FALL CREEK & MILLERSVILLE ROADS (SLOW & EASY) - Meet at 1:30 PM at the south end of the Third Christian Church parking lot, 5220 East Fall Creek Parkway, North Drive, for a slow and easy hike of 3 to 4 miles. Leader: Alberta Neill (634-7672).

NOV 2 (Saturday) FLOWING WELL HIKE - Meet at 10:00 AM in the parking lot near James Tavern at Keystone at the Crossing shopping center on 86th street just east of Keystone Avenue for an easy 12 mile road hike. Bring lunch. Water will be courtesy of the Flowing Well. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791).

NOV 3 (Sunday) GNAW BONE CAMP - Allow about 1-1/2 hours driving time. Take SR 135 south to Nashville. Turn left on SR 46 and go a couple of miles past the north entrance to Brown County State Park to where SR 135 turns right (south). Go south on 135 a couple of miles to the Gnow Bone Camp entrance on the left. Assemble at 9:30 AM for the morning hike of 6 to 7 miles. The afternoon hike will start about 1:00 PM and will also be from 6 to 7 miles. Those taking both hikes should bring lunch and water. Moderate to rugged - some hills. There will be a camp fee of \$1.00 per person. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538).

NOV 5 (Tuesday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the sign for Morgan-Monroe State Forest. Go about 4 miles to the forest entrance. Turn left and drive to the fire tower parking lot for a moderate hike of about 5 miles. This hike will be repeated each Tuesday during November. Leader: Bill Flora (898-0760). Hike to start at 9:30 AM.

- NOV 9 (Saturday) LOGANSPOUT - WABASH RIVER - From Kokomo go north on US 35 By-Pass west of Logansport. Turn east onto US 24 toward town. Go 1/2 mile and park in the lot near a Hook's Drug Store on the north side of US 24. Allow 1-3/4 hours travel time. Meet at 9:30 AM for a 15 mile road hike along the Wabash River and the City. Trail lunch and water. Leaders: Marge & Bob Begeman (359-4174).
- NOV 10 (Sunday) INDIANAPOLIS MOTOR SPEEDWAY - Take west 16th street to the Speedway entrance (4790 W. 16th), and park in the Museum parking lot. About 5 miles of easy hiking around the track and the grounds. Hike to start at 2:00 PM. Those who wish to visit the museum should do so before the hike, as there may not be time enough afterwards. (Admission fee to Museum). Leader: Nell Larrison (359-7538).
- NOV 12 (Tuesday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - See instructions for November 5th.
- NOV 14 (Thursday) GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND CLUB SOCIAL - (For members and their invited guests only). Meet at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall of the Covenant Presbyterian Church at 2305 N. Kitley. (Park in the rear and enter from the parking lot. DIRECTIONS: Kitley is 6500 east, between Arlington and Shadeland on 21st street. Go north on Kitley from 21st to the second church on the right. There will be a short business meeting and a discussion of club activities. Our program for the evening will feature Brian Cossell and his slide show "RIVER RAFTING THE GRAND CANYON".
- NOV 16 (Saturday) HICKORY RIDGE - Allow 2-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to SR 46. Go east through Bloomington and turn right on SR 446. Cross the Monroe Reservoir causeway and go 4.3 miles. Turn left at the road just past the Maumee Boy Scout reservation sign. Go about 6 miles to the fire tower parking area. Assemble at 11:00 AM for a 10 mile moderate hike. Bring trail lunch and water. Leader: Linda Elliott. (643-1842).
- NOV 17 (Sunday) WHITEWATER STATE PARK - Allow 2-1/2 hours travel time. Take US 52 to Rushville. Then SR 44 east to Liberty, and SR 101 south to the park. Entrance fee. Assemble in the beach parking lot at 9:30 AM for moderate to rugged hikes of 8 and 12 miles. Trail lunch and liquid. Leaders: Linda Elliott (634-1842) and Barbara McNeely.
- NOV 19 (Tuesday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - See instructions for November 5th.
- NOV 23 (Saturday) LAUGHERY CREEK - PART I - A 25 mile road hike over easy terrain. Take I-74 to Greensburg, SR 421 to Versailles and SR 50 east to Elrod. Turn right on Friendship road at Elrod and proceed to the parking lot of the National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association in Friendship. Allow 2 hours driving time from Indianapolis. Meet at 8:30 AM PROMPTLY due to the need for a car shuttle. Bring trail lunch and liquid, and be prepared to wade a stream. Leaders: Marge & Bob Begeman. (359-4174)
- NOV 24 (Sunday) 30TH STREET-PARK DEPT. HIKE - Meet at 2:00 PM in the parking area at White River Parkway, west drive, just north of West 30th St. for a 6 mile moderate hike. Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717).
- NOV 26 (Tuesday) MORGAN-MONROE STATE FOREST - See instructions for November 5th.
- NOV 29 - DEC 1 (Friday through Sunday) BACKPACK - RED RIVER GORGE, KENTUCKY. - General Information: This is a very rugged backpack of 20 miles. Please call the leader, Ron Craig (255-6215) for reservations and the answer to questions concerning the area and equipment needed, and transportation. Travel time: Allow 4-1/2 hours. From Lexington, Ky., take I-64 east 15 miles to Winchester and exit on the Bert Combs Mountain Parkway. Follow the Parkway 34 miles to the Slade, Ky. exit. Then take KY 15 east approximately 4 miles to the Koomer Ridge Campground. Meet at Koomer Ridge at 12:30 PM for a shuttle to the Trail Head.

- NOV 30 (Saturday) KEYSTONE SQUARE SHOPPING CENTER HIKE - Meet at Keystone Square Shopping Center, 116th street and Keystone Ave., parking near the Woodland Theatre area. There will be two hikes of approximately 6 and 11 miles of mainly sidewalk walking, starting at 9:00 AM. Leader: June Pogue (1-453-1745).
- DEC 1 (Sunday) MCCORMICK'S CREEK STATE PARK - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 67 south to Spencer. Turn east on SR 46 and go a few miles to the Park. Possible entrance fee. Assemble in the parking area near the Lodge at 1:30 PM for an easy to moderate hike from 5 to 6 miles. Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).
- DEC 7 (Saturday) METAMORA CHRISTMAS HIKES - Allow 1-1/2 hours for travel. Take US 52 southeast to Metamora. Turn right and go into the town. Meet in the Whitewater Canal State Memorial parking lot on Clayborne Street. There will be an easy 4 mile hike starting at 3:00 PM. This historical old town will be decorated for the Christmas season, and as it gets dusk, the luminaries will be lighted all over town. Leaders: Mary and Win Pulsifer (784-1835).
- DEC 8 (Sunday) LOCKERBIE SQUARE HIKE AND TOUR OF JAMES WHITCOMB RILEY HOME - Meet at 11:45 AM in front of the Riley Home, which is on Lockerbie Street between East Street and Park Avenue (just north of New York Street). We will tour the home first and then have an easy hike of 2 miles. Entrance fees are \$1.00 for adults and 25¢ for ages 12 through 15, Children under 12 are admitted free.
