- ✗ AUG 5 (Tuesday) CHRISTIAN PARK - Each Tuesday night during August there will be a self-guided hike of 4 or 8 miles to begin at 5:45 PM. The hike will leave from the Community Center at Christian Park, 4200 block of east English Avenue. Leaders: Bob & Marge Begeman (359-4174).
- ✗ AUG 6 (Wednesday) SCOTTISH RITE CATHEDRAL - Meet in the parking lot to the west of the Cathedral at 12:45 PM for a tour of the Cathedral and a two mile downtown hike. The tour and the parking for the time required for the tour and hike will be free. Scottish Rite Cathedral is at 650 N. Meridian Street. Leader: Alberta Neill (634-7672)
- ✗ AUG 9 (Saturday) SOUTHEASTWAY PARK - Meet at 7:00 AM for an 11 mile hike. Assemble in the parking lot at Southeastway Park, 5624 south on East County Line Road. Leader: Ursula Breeding (359-8686).

- ✗ AUG 12 (Tuesday) CHRISTIAN PARK - See instructions for August 5th.
- ✗ AUG 13 (Wednesday) MAROTT PARK AND NATURE PRESERVE - Meet in the parking lot over the canal on Westfield Blvd. just east of College Ave. in Broad Ripple at 9:00 AM for a 4 to 6 mile hike. Leader: Dorothy Field (253-7114).
- AUG 15 (Friday) SOCIAL GET-TOGETHER - VELODROME BIKE RACES - See enclosed flier.
- ✗ AUG 16 (Saturday) VERSAILLES STATE PARK - Allow about 2 hours driving time. Take I-74 south and east to the Greensburg exit. (SR 421). Follow 421 south to Versailles. Go east on US 50 a couple of miles to the Park entrance (Admission fee). Follow the park road up the steep hill to the main picnic area. Assemble at 1:00 PM for a moderate to rugged hike of 6 to 7 miles. Leader: Fred Eckstein (996-2597).
- ✗ AUG 17 (Sunday) SHADES STATE PARK - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take I-74 west to the Jamestown exit. Go through Jamestown and follow SR 234 west to the park entrance. (Admission fee). Meet in the picnic parking area at 2:00 PM for about 5 miles of moderate to rugged hiking. NOTE: Keep to the left past the gate house). Leader: Odie Cassetty (244-9913).
- ✗ AUG 19 (Tuesday) CHRISTIAN PARK - See instructions for August 5th.

- ✓ SEP 1 (Monday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at 7:30 AM in the parking lot just inside the 56th street gate for a 9 mile hike. Leader: Ursula Breeding (359-8686).
- ✓ SEP 2 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at 10:00 AM in the parking lot just inside the 56th street gate for an easy 6 to 8 mile hike. Leader: Mary Pulsifer (784-1835).
- ✓ SEP 3 (Wednesday) SPEEDWAY LEVEE/THATCHER - Meet at the Thatcher Community Center 4649 W. Vermont St. for self-guided hikes of 4, 6, or 10 miles, starting at 5:30 PM. Leaders: Frank & Wilma Thompson (241-7154). To be repeated each Wed in Sept.
- ✓ SEP 6 (Saturday) DEAM WILDERNESS AREA - Assemble at 9:30 AM for a moderate to rugged 16 mile hike. Allow 2-1/4 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to SR 46. Go east through Bloomington and turn right on SR 446. Cross the Monroe Reservoir causeway and go 4.3 miles further. Turn left on the road just past the Maumee Boy Scout sign. Go about 6 miles to the fire tower parking lot. Bring trail lunch and water. Leader: Al Drehabl (898-3632).
- ✓ SEP 7 (Sunday) MARY GRAY BIRD SANCTUARY - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time from the east side of Indianapolis. Take SR 52 southeast to Rushville, then east on SR 44 about 11 miles to a sign for Mary Gray. Turn right on 525 W and go south to a "T". Turn left and go a short distance to the first road on the right (450 W). Turn right and go a couple of miles to the entrance to Mary Gray Bird Sanctuary on the right. (Watch closely as you come to it suddenly on a sharp curve to the left). Meet at 1:00 PM for an 8 mile hike. There will be a shorter hike available. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538).
- ✓ SEP 9 (Tuesday) CROWN HILL CEMETERY - Enter through gate on Clarendon Road, just north of West 38th street, and park on driveway behind Mausoleum. 5 mile hike to start at 9:00 AM. Leader: Dorothy Field (253-7114).
- ✓ SEP 10 (Wednesday) SPEEDWAY LEVEE/THATCHER - See instructions for Sept 3rd.
- SEP 11 (Thursday) GENERAL ASSEMBLY & CLUB SOCIAL - (For members and their invited guests). Meet at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall of the Covenant Presbyterian Church at 2305 N. Kitley. The nominating committee is presenting the following slate of candidates for office:

Jim Jones, Alice Roth, Tom Bowers, Estelle Cope.

The voting for the five line officers will be done separately and the defeated candidates will automatically be considered as nominees for the office of Director before the balloting for the Directors commences. Further nominations from the floor may be made for any of the offices by any member if properly moved and seconded. All persons nominated from the floor must be present at the meeting.

The following proposed amendments to the By-Laws are to be voted on. As authorized by the Constitution, the amendments were presented in writing at the Board of Directors meeting on May 15, 1986 and were approved for a vote of adoption.

Section 4(a) - To read as follows:

A Nominating Committee of three (3) members shall be appointed by the President, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors. The Committee shall present a slate of candidates for the elective offices at the General Assembly meeting in September. "The Committee shall endeavor to present a slate offering two qualified candidates for each of the offices of President, Vice President, Pathfinder, Secretary, Treasurer, and six or more candidates for the office of Director". This list is to be published in the club bulletin which contains the September schedule.

Section 5(a) - To read as follows:

The election of Officers and Directors shall be held at the annual General Assembly meeting in September (Article VII of the Constitution). "The Board of Directors shall adopt a procedure for absentee voting in the election of Officers and Directors. Those voting absentee must vote for the slate as presented by the Nominating Committee. There will be no write in votes. Section 5c and 5d of the By-Laws shall not apply to absentee ballots."

NOTE: The writing between the quotation marks above indicates the changes in the by-laws.

- 4 SEP 13 (Saturday) SWEETWATER, CORDRY LAKES - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 135 south to SR 252. Go east on SR 252 to Nineveh- Prince's Lakes signs. Then go right through Nineveh for about 7.5 miles. Do not follow Prince's Lake signs, but do follow the Church of the Lakes signs. Go slow after leaving Nineveh because of the narrow roads. Parking may be limited, so carpool if possible. Hikes of 5 or 10 miles to start at 10:00 AM. Bring lunch and water. Leader: Joe Wilhelm (241-3695).
- 4 SEP 14 (Sunday) HISTORIC IRVINGTON WALKING TOUR - Meet in the parking lot across the street (north) from the Missions Building, 222 South Downey, in old Irvington at 2:00 PM for a 3 mile tour of part of Old Irvington. Leaders: Alberta Neill (634-7672) and Juanita Lauth (353-6325).
- X SEP 16 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - See instructions for September 2nd.
- 4 SEP 17 (Wednesday) SPEEDWAY LEVEE/THATCHER - See instructions for September 3rd.
- X SEP 20 (Saturday) FOUR LAKES - ED CHAMBERS BIRTHDAY HIKE - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the Morgan-Monroe State Forest sign and go about 4 miles to the forest entrance. IF YOU ARE GOING ON THE 14 to 16 MILE HIKE, turn right and go to parking lot for Bryant Creek lake. IF YOU ARE GOING ON THE SHORTER 8 MILE HIKE, drop your passengers at Bryant Creek and then continue about 2.6 miles to the road for Beanblossom Lake. Turn right and go a mile to the Lake parking area on right. BE THERE BY 9:40 AM TO BE SHUTTLED BACK TO THE BRYANT CREEK AREA where the hikes will begin at 10:00 AM. Short hikers bring liquid but lunches can be left in the cars at Beanblossom. The long hikers should carry liquid and lunch. Leaders: Peggy & Hayden Franzen (812 988-2461).

- SEP 21 (Sunday) (A) GLENDALE TO CIRCLE - There will be hikes of 9 and 18 to 19 miles. Assemble at the Glendale Shopping Center on the east side of Rural Street at 8:00 AM. Bring trail lunch and water for picnic in University Park. Hikers going only one way are responsible for arranging their own transportation back to their cars. Leader: Tom Patterson (849-9528).
- (B). SPEEDWAY LEVEE HIKE - Assemble at the Westwood Country Club at 2:00 PM for an easy hike of about 4 miles. DIRECTIONS: From 6200 West Tenth (just east of I-465) go north on Vinewood Drive one half block to High School Road. Turn left and follow High School Road north to the Westwood Country Club. Leader: Odie Cassetty (244-9913).
- SEP 23 (Tuesday) (A) ^{White River} CANAL HIKE - Park in the lot on White River Parkway, West Drive, just north of 30th street. Meet at 10:00 AM for an easy 5 to 6 mile hike. Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).
- (B) BROAD RIPPLE - CANAL - Meet at 5:30 PM in the parking lot over the canal, just east of College Ave. in Broad Ripple. There will be self-guided hikes of 4 or 8 miles. Leader: Tom Patterson (849-9528).
- SEP 24 (Wednesday) SPEEDWAY LEVEE/THATCHER - See instructions for September 3rd.
- SEP 27 (Saturday) JACKSON STATE FOREST - Allow 2 hours travel time from south side of Indianapolis. Take I-65 south to the Seymour exit, US 50 West. Go west on US 50 to Brownstown. Take SR 250 left about 3 miles to the Jackson State Forest entrance on the LEFT. Assemble in the parking lot beyond the lake at 9:00 AM for moderate to rugged hikes of 7 and 15 miles. Bring trail lunch and water. Leader: Al Drehobl (898-3632).
- SEP 28 (Sunday) (A) CANAL - BROADRIPPLE TO DOWNTOWN - There will be hikes of 9 and 18 miles. Assemble in the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple just east of College Ave. at 8:00 AM. Bring trail lunch and water for picnic in University Park. Hikers going one way only are responsible for arranging their own transportation back to their cars. Leader: Tom Patterson (849-9528).
- (B) HISTORIC IRVINGTON TOUR - Meet in the parking lot across the street (north) from the Missions Building, 222 South Downey in old Irvington at 2:00 PM for a 3 mile walking tour of part of old Irvington. This will be a different tour from the Sep 14th tour. Leaders: Alberta Neill (634-7672) and Juanita Lauth (353-6325).
- SEP 30 (Tuesday) (A) EAGLE CREEK PARK - See instructions for September 2nd.
- (B) BROAD RIPPLE - CANAL - See instructions for September 23rd.
- OCT 1 (Wednesday) ELLENBERGER PARK - Meet at Ellenberger Park, 5400 block of East St. Clair between 5:15 and 5:30 PM for a 4, 6, or 8 mile self-guided hike. Leader: Ursula Breeding (359-8686). (NOTE: This hike will be repeated each Wednesday during October)
- OCT 4 & 5 (Saturday & Sunday) BACKPACK IN HOOSIER NATIONAL FOREST - Be sure to contact Libby Moore (852-4717) for reservations and information about this backpack. Take SR 37 south to Bloomington, then follow SR 46 east to SR 446. Turn right and go about 12 miles. About 1/2 miles past the Hardin Ridge sign you will come to the Tower Road on the left (just after the Maumee Boy Scout sign). Turn left and go about a mile to the Horsemen Camp. Meet there at 11:00 AM on Saturday.
- OCT 4 (Saturday) CATARACT FALLS FESTIVAL - Take I-70 west to the Cloverdale exit. Take US 231 south for about 7 miles to the sign for the Cataract Falls State Recreation area. Turn right and go about 3 miles to the entrance. There may be an admission fee. Allow 1-1/4 hours driving time. Meet at 10:30 AM for an easy to moderate hike of 6 miles and 12 miles. We will eat lunch in the village of Cataract where there will be a festival in progress. The entrees are HAM & BEANS and SLOPPY JOES. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791).
- OCT 5 (Sunday) HOLIDAY PARK - A moderate 5 mile hike will begin at 1:00 PM in the parking lot over the canal in Broad Ripple just east of College Ave. Leader: Alice Brink (255-0155).
