- JUN 9 (Tuesday) (A) WHITE RIVER - CANAL HIKE - Meet in the lot on White River Parkway, West Drive, just north of 30th Street at 9:30 AM for an easy 5 to 6 mile hike. (F,HS,2.5). Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439)
- (B) WHITE RIVER PARKWAY - Each Tuesday in June, there will be a 4 and 8 mile self-guided hike, to begin at 5:30 PM. Park in the lot on White River Parkway, West Drive, just north of 30th Street. (White River Parkway runs along the west side of White River). (F,PS). Leaders: Bob & Marge Begeman (359-4174).
- JUN 13 (Saturday) WHITE RIVER/RAVENSWOOD - Meet in the east parking lot of Kohl's, 7300 block of North Keystone Avenue for a 6 and a 12 mile hike starting at 10:30 A.M. Bring lunch and water for longer hike. (F,PS,3). Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791).
- JUN 14 (Sunday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at 2:00 P.M. in the parking lot near the 56th Street entrance for a 6 mile hike. (M,NS,2.5-3). Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).
- JUN 16 (Tuesday) (A) PITTSBORO TOWN AND COUNTRY - Allow 30 to 45 minutes travel time. Take US 136 west to Pittsboro and meet at the town park, 1/2 block east of the stop light on US 136. Meet at 10:00 A.M. for an easy 6 mile hike. (F,PS,2.5). Leader: Maxine Sparks (892-3490).
- (B) WHITE RIVER PARKWAY - See instructions for June 9 (B).
- JUN 20 (Saturday) CLIFTY FALLS VOLKSMARCH - The Club will participate in the 2nd annual AUL/Indiana State Parks Volksmarch. Allow 2-1/2 hours driving time. Take I-65 south to the Austin exit, and follow US 256 east to US 62. Follow US 62 north 3 miles to the north entrance. (No entrance fee for participants). Park in the north parking lot. Wear Club shirt, vest, and name tag. Bring lunch and water. Locate Hiking Club group behind shelter house. (First hike). MADISON TRAIL goes from top of cliffs to riverbed below - very rugged (7 miles). (Second hike). CONSTITUTION TRAIL (6-1/2 miles) This is an easier hike, with some stairs, narrow paths, and paved roads. All Club hikers must register with leader before starting hikes. Self-guided hikes leave promptly at 9:00 A.M. Leader: Jackie McKelfresh (356-3734).
- JUN 21 (Sunday) WEST SIDE OF WHITE RIVER - Meet in the lot on White River Parkway, West Drive, just north of 30th Street at 2:00 P.M. for a 6 mile hike. (F,HS,2.5 - 3). Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).
- JUN 23 (Tuesday) (A) WHITE RIVER CANAL HIKE - See instructions for (A) June 9.
- (B) WHITE RIVER PARKWAY - See instructions for (B) June 9.

- JUN 27 (Saturday) SHADES STATE PARK - The plan is to hike every trail in the Park as well as some additional hiking in Pine Hills Nature Preserve. There will be approximately 15 to 20 miles of hiking, with the short trails being hiked first, so shorter distance hikers may stop at a lesser mileage. Take the route of your choice to Shades State Park, turning left after the gatehouse. Meet at 9:30 A.M. at the Campground #1 parking lot. Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Entry fee. Bring trail lunch and liquid. (M,NS,3). Leader: John V. Behrmann (462-7058).
- JUN 28 (Sunday) LOW GAP TRAIL - MORGAN MONROE - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the sign for Morgan-Monroe State Forest and go about 4 miles to the entrance. Turn left and drive 5 miles to the fire tower parking area. Meet at 11:00 A.M. for a hike of 9 or 13 miles. Bring trail lunch and water. (M,NS,3). Leader: Al Drehobl (898-3632).
- JUN 30 (Tuesday) (A) WHITE RIVER CANAL HIKE - See instructions for (A) June 9.

- JUL 1 (Wednesday) SPEEDWAY VARIETY - Meet at 9:00 A.M. in the Marsh parking lot, 5900 Crawfordsville Road for a 5 to 6 mile hike. Varieties of this hike will be repeated each Wednesday morning during July, leading N. S. E. W. - some on the levee, others through residential areas and around the Coca Cola field north of the 500 track. (F, Variety, 3). Leader: Wilma Thompson (241-7154).
- JUL 4 (Saturday) (A) FALL CREEK AND THEREABOUTS - Meet in lot below bank/office building in Windridge Center, 5500 N. Emerson, for 6 to 7 mile starting at 7:30 A.M. Route will be different from hike of May 25. (F,P&NS,3) Leader: Dorothy Field (253-7114)
(B) HALF-CENTURY (50 MILES) HIKE - PART 1 - Today and tomorrow (Sunday) there will be hikes of 25 miles, with shorter hikes possible. Assemble in the Statehouse parking lot at 7:30 A.M. each day. (F,PS,3.5 or more). Those planning to go on this hike should contact the leader, Tom Patterson, in advance for more information regarding shuttles, etc. (849-9528).
- JUL 5 (Sunday) (A) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet in the parking lot inside the 56th Street entrance at 2:00 P.M. for a 6 mile hike. (M,NS,2.5). Leaders: Hank & Libby Moore (852-4717)
(B) HALF-CENTURY HIKE - PART 2 - See instructions for (B) July 4.
- JUL 7 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet in the parking lot inside the 56th Street entrance at 5:30 P.M. for a hike of 5 to 6 miles. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717). This hike will be repeated each Tuesday in July.
- JUL 8 (Wednesday) SPEEDWAY VARIETY - See instructions for July 1.
- JUL 11 (Saturday) KNOBSTONE TRAIL - NEW CHAPEL TO ELK CREEK - Allow 2-1/2 hours driving time. Take I-65 south to the Salem exit at Scottsburg. Go west on SR 56 for 8.3 miles. Turn left at the sign for Elk Creek Lake. Go south 2.2 miles, following signs for the State Fishing Area. Meet at 9:00 A.M. for a car shuttle. Bring trail lunch and water for a 16 mile hike. (H,NS,3). Leader: Al Drehobl (898-3632).
- JUL 12 (Sunday) WHITEWATER STATE PARK - Allow 2-1/2 hours travel time. Take U.S. 52 east to Rushville. Then SR 44 east to Liberty, and SR 101 south to the park. Assemble in the beach parking area at 11:00 A.M. for an 8 mile hike. A second hike of 5 miles will begin about 2:00 P.M. (M,NS,3). Leader: Fred Eckstein (996-2597).
- JUL 14 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - See instructions for July 7.
- JUL 15 (Wednesday) SPEEDWAY VARIETY HIKE - See instructions for July 1.

JUL 18 (Saturday) ANNUAL SUMMER PICNIC - (For members and their invited guests only). The Club has reserved Shelter #4 at Southeastway Park. DIRECTIONS: One suggested route is to go east on SR 52 to County Line. Then south to the Park at 5624 south on East County Line Road. There will be a short hike starting at 10:00 A.M. followed by games and entertainment. We plan to eat about 1:00 P.M. Bring food to contribute to our old-fashioned pitch-in picnic. PROTECT FOOD FROM THE HEAT WITH ICE CHESTS. Bring your own table service. The social committee is working on various picnic activities.

JUL 19 (Sunday) SPRING MILL STATE PARK - Allow 2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to Mitchell, then east on SR 60 a couple of miles to the Park entrance. Entry fee. Meet at 1:00 P.M. in the parking lot for the Pioneer Village for an 8 mile hike. There will be a shorter hike available. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538).

JUL 21 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - See instructions for July 7.

JUL 22 (Wednesday) SPEEDWAY VARIETY - See instructions for July 1.

JUL 25 (Saturday) KEYSTONE CLOVERLEAF - Meet in the parking lot at west side of James Tavern, east 86th Street at Keystone Crossing Blvd. for an 8 mile hike starting at 7:30 A.M. No restrooms on hike route. Leader: Dorothy Field (253-7114) (F,P,3).

JUL 26 (Sunday) VERSAILLES STATE PARK - Allow about 2 hours driving time. Take I-74 southeast to the Greensburg exit. Then follow U.S. 421 south to Versailles. Go east on U.S. 50 a couple of miles to the State Park. (Entrance Fee). Follow the park road up the steep hill to the main picnic parking area. Assemble at 1:00 P.M. for a moderate hike of 6 to 7 miles. M,NS,2.5). Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538).
