- OCT 10 (Saturday) 30TH ANNIVERSARY STEW HIKE AT GNAW BONE CAMP - This is your opportunity to help the Club celebrate our 30th Anniversary with a hike and a good meal at Gnow Bone Camp. Allow 1-1/2 hours driving time. Take SR 135 south to Nashville, then left on SR 46 a few miles to where SR 135 turns right (south). Take SR 135 south a couple of miles to the entrance to Gnow Bone Camp on the left. Hiking will start at 9:30 AM. Up to 10 miles of hikes with shorter hikes available. The meal consisting of beef stew, corn bread, slaw, hot and cold drinks, and dessert will be at 1:30 PM. COST PER PERSON: \$4.00 - payable at the camp. In order to plan for the number of people for the meal, it is important that you make reservations with Bill Larrison at 359-7538. If in doubt if you have made a previous reservation please confirm by calling again. LET'S HAVE A BIG TURNOUT FOR THIS 30TH ANNIVERSARY EVENT. You don't have to hike. If just coming for the meal please feel free to come down to the Camp anytime before we eat at 1:30 PM.
- OCT 11 (Sunday) MERIDIAN-KESSLER NEIGHBORHOOD - Meet in the St. Joan of Arc school playground just off 42nd Street between Central and College Avenues at 11:45 A.M. There will be a 15 minute pipe organ concert played by Norma Huber in the Church before hikes of 6 and 12 miles. (F,PS,3). Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791)
- OCT 13 (Tuesday) A. MORGAN MONROE STATE FOREST - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 37 south to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the sign for Morgan Monroe and go about 4 miles to the forest entrance. Turn left and drive to the fire tower parking lot for a moderate hike of about 5 miles. This hike will be repeated each Tuesday in October. Hike to start at 9:30 AM. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Bill Flora (898-0760)
B. ELLENBERGER PARK - Meet at Ellenberger Park, 5400 block of East St. Clair between 5:15 and 5:30 for 4, 6, or 8 mile self-guided hikes. To be repeated each Tuesday in October. (F, PS). Leader: Ursula Breeding (359-8686).
- OCT 17 (Saturday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - WEST - Take West 56th Street to Eagle Creek Park and park in the lot just west of the causeway. Meet at 12:00 Noon for a 5 to 6 mile hike thru steep hills. (H,NS,3). Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717).
- OCT 18 (Sunday) A. DEVINGTON & BEYOND - Meet at Devington Shopping Center at 8:00 AM for a self-guided 31 mile road hike. Shorter options available. You may want to bring water. Several food opportunities along hike. (F,PS).Leader: Charlie Brunette(542-1355)
B. RACCOON LAKE STATE RECREATION AREA - 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take US 36 west to Raccoon Lake. Entrance Fee. Meet in first parking lot on left. 5 to 6 mile hike to start at 1:00 PM. (M,NS, 2.5-3). Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).

- OCT 20 (Tuesday) ~~A.~~ MORGAN MONROE STATE FOREST - See instructions for Oct. 13th
~~B.~~ ELLENBERGER PARK - See instructions for Oct. 13th.
- OCT 24 (Saturday) KNOBSTONE TRAIL - Meet at Spurgeon Hollow trailhead PROMPTLY at 9:00 AM for a car shuttle. Moderate to rugged 15 mile hike between Elk Creek and Spurgeon Hollow. 2-1/2 hours travel time. Take I-65 south to Seymour exit. Go west on US 50 through Brownstown. Take SR 135 south about 9.1 miles and turn left just after the Muscatatuck river bridge. Follow Delaney Park signs. Continue past Delaney Park and turn left at the sign for Spurgeon Hollow (short distance past Delaney Park). Park near the lake. Bring trail lunch and water. (H,NS,3). Leader: Al Drehobl(898-3632). DO NOT BE LATE FOR THE CAR SHUTTLE.
- OCT 25 (Sunday) EAGLE CREEK PARK = Meet at 1:00 PM in parking lot just inside the 56th Street gate for an easy 6 to 8 mile hike. (M,NS,2.5-3). Leader: Mary Pulsifer (784-1835).
- OCT 27 (Tuesday) ~~A.~~ MORGAN MONROE STATE FOREST - See instructions for Oct. 13th.

- OCT 31 (Saturday) SWEETWATER - CORDRY LAKES - 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 135 south to SR 252. Go east on 252 to signs for Nineveh. Turn right and go south through Nineveh for about 7.5 miles. DO NOT follow Prince's Lake signs but DO FOLLOW Church of the Lake signs. Go slow - narrow roads. Do Not park at the church. Park near the saleshouse. Parking limited, so car-pool if possible. Self-guided hikes of 5, 10, or 15 miles begin at 10:00 AM. Bring lunch & water. (M,PS). Leader: Joe Wilhelm (241-3695).
- NOV 1 (Sunday) LIEBER STATE RECREATION AREA - 1-1/2 hours driving time. Take I-70 west to the exit for SR 243. Go south to the Park. Admission fee. Assemble in the picnic parking area, which is the left fork near the end of the road to the beach. Meet at 1:30 PM, easy to moderate hike of 6 miles. (M,NS,2.5-3). Leaders: Wilma Thompson (241-7154), and Lynda Neher (745-3312).
- NOV 4 (Wednesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at 2:00 PM in the parking lot just inside the 56th Street gate for easy 5 mile hike. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717).
- NOV 5 (Thursday) BOGGSTOWN INN AND CABARET - This is a repeat visit to this center for Ragtime and old time music and entertainment. Plan for an evening of very enjoyable fun. The doors open at 6:00 and the performances start at 7:00 PM. The meals are from about \$12.00 to about \$17.00. This is by reservation only, and Jim Ernsting has reserved space for 50 people. - NOV 7 (Saturday) SALAMONIE SNOWMOBILE TRAIL - 2 hours travel. Meet at 9:30 AM for approx. 15 mile hike. Take I-69 north and exit on Hwy 5, which is the Huntington/Warren/Salamonie Reservoir exit. Go north on Hwy 5 for a mile, and turn left (west) on Hwy 124. Go through Mt. Etna (approx 6 miles) and continue on Hwy 124 across Hwy 9. Go .4 mile beyond Hwy 9 and turn right at Mt. Etna State Recreation Area sign. Go .3 mile and turn left on the first road beyond the trailer park to the parking lot. Bring trail lunch and water. (M,NS,3). Leader: Karleen Huneck (1-453-4270).
- NOV 8 (Sunday) SHAKAMAK STATE PARK - Allow 2-1/2 hours for travel. Take I-70 west, then south on SR 59, and SR 48 west to the Park entrance. Admission Fee. Follow signs to the beach parking area, and park near the shelter house. There will be a 6 mile moderate hike starting at 2:00 PM. (M,NS,3). Leader: Odie Cassetty (244-9913).
- NOV 11 (Wednesday) ~~A.~~ EAGLE CREEK PARK - See instructions for Nov. 4th
~~B.~~ WINDRIDGE AREA VETERAN'S DAY HIKE - Meet at the Windridge Shopping Center, 54th and Emerson Way, at 7:00 AM for a 13 mile self-guided hike. Park near Bank One. (F,PS). Leader: Charlie Brunette (542-1355).

- NOV 12 (Thursday) GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND CLUB SOCIAL - (For members and their invited guests only). Meet at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall of the Covenant Presbyterian Church at 2305 N. Kitley. (Park in rear and enter from the parking lot). DIRECTIONS: Kitley is 6500 east between Arlington and Shadeland. Take 21st Street to Kitley, and go north to the second church on the right. There will be a short business meeting. Our program for the evening is a presentation by Brian Cossell. He will entertain us with his slides of a trip through Yugoslavia. Refreshments will be served.
- NOV 14 (Saturday) SHADES STATE PARK - Plan to hike every trail in the Park as well as some additional hiking in Pine Hills Nature Preserve. Approximately 15 to 20 miles, with the short trails being hiked first, so shorter distance hikers may stop at a lesser mileage. Take route of your choice to Shades State Park, Keep to the left past the Gatehouse, and meet at 9:00 AM at the Campground #1 parking lot. 1-1/2 hours travel time. Bring lunch & water. (M,NS,3). - NOV 15 (Sunday) A. TIPPECANOE RIVER STATE PARK - Take US 421 north into SR 29, and take SR 29 north into US 35. Go north on US 35 to the Park on the right side of the road. Admission Fee. Go past Park office, and turn right at the next road and park in the fire tower (trailhead) parking area. There will be a rugged hike of 15 to 20 miles. Assemble at 9:00 AM. Allow 2-1/2 hours travel time. Bring lunch and water. (H,NS,3.5). Leader: Charles Brunette (542-1355).
B. MCCORMICK'S CREEK STATE PARK - 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 67 south to Spencer, then east on SR 46 a couple of miles to the Park entrance. Fee. Assemble in parking area near nature center at 1:00 PM for a moderate 6 mile hike. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538).
- NOV 18 (Wednesday) 30TH STREET - PARK DEPT HIKE - Meet at 10:00 AM in the parking area at White River Parkway, West Drive, just north of West 30th Street for a 6 mile moderate hike. (F,PS,2.5). Leader: Libby Moore (852-4717).
- NOV 21 (Saturday) BROWN COUNTY STATE PARK - 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 135 south through Nashville to the Park. Meet at 10:00 AM at the fire tower parking lot for a 10 mile hike. Bring lunch and water. (H,NS,2.5) Leader: Peggy & Heydon Franzen (1-812-988-2461)
- NOV 22 (Sunday) PRINCESS LAKES HIKE - 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take SR 135 south. Go east on SR 252 to Nineveh and follow the signs to Princess Lakes. About 3 miles south of Nineveh, you turn to the right and then immediately to the left. Park at the liquor store parking lot. Meet at 2:00 PM for a 5 to 7 mile hike. Bring water. (M,PS,3). - NOV 25 (Wednesday) 30TH STREET - PARK DEPT HIKE - See instructions for Nov. 18th.
- NOV 28 (Saturday) METAMORA CHRISTMAS HIKE - 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take US 52 southeast to Metamora. Turn right and go into town. Meet in the Whitewater Canal State Memorial parking lot up the hill on Clayborne Street. Easy 4 mile hike starting at 3:30 PM. The town will be decorated for Christmas and as it gets dusk the luminaries will be lighted all over town. (F,HS,2.5) Leader: Win & Mary Pulsifer (784-1835).
