- AUG 9 (Tuesday) (A) EAGLE CREEK PARK - WEST - Take West 56th St. to Eagle Creek Park and park in the lot just west of the causeway. Meet at 8:30 AM for a 5-6 mile hike. Bring water. This hike will be repeated on remaining Tuesdays during August. Leader: Sam Lloyd (241-3557). (M,NS,2.5).
(B) CHRISTIAN PARK - Meet at the Community Center of Christian Park 4200 East English Ave at 6:00 PM for self-guided hikes of 4 or 8 miles. This hike will be repeated on Aug 16, 23, and 30. Leaders: Marge & Bob Begeman (359-4174) (F,PS).
- AUG 10 (Wednesday) CHANNEL 20 - Park in the station's lot north of the building at 1401 N. Meridian St. and meet in the lobby at 1:00 PM for a tour. (No fee, but donations are accepted). After tour there will be a two mile hike (SLOW & EASY). Leader: Alberta Neill (634-7672). (F,PS,2.5).
- AUG 13 (Saturday) (A) FLATROCK RIVER - Allow one hour driving time for this easy, 10 mile hike. Take I-74 southeast to the Middletown/St.Paul exit. Follow signs to the YMCA Flatrock Camp. Meet at 1:00 PM for this hike partly on roads and partly in the woods. Bring water. Leader: Carol Ernsting (257-7146). (F,PS/NS,3).
(B) LIEBER STATE RECREATION AREA - Allow 1-1/2 hours driving time. Take I-70 west to the SR 243 exit. Go south to the Park (Entrance fee). Meet at 1:30 PM in the picnic parking area which is the left fork near the end of the road to the beach. Easy to moderate 5 to 6 mile hike. Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538). (F,NS,2.5-3).
- AUG 14 (Sunday) BEANBLOSSOM/BEAR WALLOW - Allow 1-1/4 hours travel time, SR 135 south. Meet at the IGA in Beanblossom at 2:00 PM for a 6 to 7 mile hike. Hikers are invited to Mickie & John Williams' Open House after the hike. Leader: John Williams (812 988-0207) (M,NS/PS, 2.5-3)
- AUG 16 (Tuesday) (A) EAGLE CREEK PARK - WEST - See instructions for Aug 9 (A).
(B) CHRISTIAN PARK - See instructions for Aug 9 (B).
- AUG 20 (Saturday) (A) COLUMBUS ARCHITECTURAL TOUR - Columbus is nationally known for its architecture. Take I-65 south to the second Columbus exit (SR 46). Go east on SR 46 and after crossing the bridge, veer right onto Second Street (one way east). Go a few blocks and turn left onto Franklin (one way north). Meet at 9:00 AM in the parking lot behind the Visitor Center. Entrance to lot is on right side north of Fifth Street. After a 20 minute slide show we will go on a 10 to 12 mile hike. Bring lunch and water. Leader: Jim Ernsting (257-7146). (F,HS,2.5).
(B) HAGERSTOWN VOLKSMARCH - 1-1/2 hours travel time. Take I-70 east to SR 1 north to SR 38 a short distance west to Hagerstown. Meet at 9:00 AM at Hagerstown Elementary School on North Sycamore. Sign the Hike Roster, then go to the start table, register & receive "walk card". Card will be validated at check points and turned in after hike. 10 Kilometers (6.2 miles). Leader: Hal Rynerson (1 987-7858) (F,NS/PS)

- AUG 21 (Sunday) EASTSIDE SURPRISE - Meet in the parking lot of the Wonder Bread Thrift Store at 30th and Shadeland Avenue at 1:00 PM for a 6 to 7 mile hike. Leaders: Cheryl Conwell (872-2583), and Jim Stern (844-3791). (F,NS/PS, 2.5-3).
- AUG 23 (Tuesday) (A) EAGLE CREEK PARK - WEST - See instructions for Aug 9 (A).
(B) CHRISTIAN PARK - See instructions for Aug 9 (B).
- AUG 27 (Saturday) ZIONSVILLE - Allow 3/4 hour travel from downtown. Meet in Lions Park, north side of SR #334, just east of Main St. at 8:00 AM for hikes of 5 and 10 miles. Bring water. Leader: Charlotte Malott (873-5270). (F,PS,3).
- AUG 28 (Sunday) SHADES STATE PARK - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take I-74 west to Jamestown exit. Go through Jamestown and follow SR 234 west to the Park entrance (Fee). Meet at 2:00 PM in the main picnic parking area at end of road to the left past the gate house, for a moderate to rugged 5 mile hike. Leader: Odie Cassetty (244-9913) (H,NS,2.5-3)
- AUG 30 (Tuesday) (A) EAGLE CREEK PARK - WEST - See instructions for Aug 9 (A).
(B) CHRISTIAN PARK - See instructions for Aug 9 (B).
- SEPT 3,4,5 (Saturday through Monday) LABOR DAY WEEKEND AT CUMBERLAND FALLS STATE PARK (For members and invited guests only). The reservation supplement for this event is included with the mailing of this schedule. The Club must cancel any rooms not used by August 20th in order to get a refund. - SEP 3 (Saturday) GERMAN PARK VOLKSMARCH - Location: 8600 S. Meridian St. After you enter the grounds of the German Park follow the directional arrows to meet the hike leader, sign the roster, then go to the start table to receive "walk card". Your card will be validated at check points and turned in after hike. The Volksmarch will tie-in with the Klub's Oktoberfest, so you may want to be a part of the festivities. Sign-in time: 2:00 PM. 10 kilometers (6.2 miles). Leader: Dennis Taft (271-7118). (F,PS).

(B) ELLENBERGER PARK - Meet at Ellenberger Park, 5400 block of East St. Clair at 5:30 PM for 4, 6, or 8 mile self-guided hikes. To be repeated each Tuesday in September. Leader: Alice Stalcup (897-1852). (F,PS).
- SEP 8 (Thursday) GENERAL ASSEMBLY & CLUB SOCIAL - (For members and their invited guests) Meet at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall of the Covenant Presbyterian Church at 2305 North Kitley. (Park in rear and enter from parking lot). DIRECTIONS: Kitley is 6500 East between Arlington and Shadeland. Take 21st Street to Kitley and go north to the second church on the right. - SEP 10 (Saturday) (A) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet near the Amphitheatre at 9:30 AM for an easy 7 mile hike. Leader: Hank Moore (852-4717) (M,NS,2.5-3).
(B) SUMMIT LAKE STATE PARK - The Park is located 8 miles north of New Castle off of SR 36. Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take I-70 east to SR 3, then north to SR 36. Go east on SR 36 and follow signs to Summit Lake Park. Meet at the swimming beach parking lot for a 12 to 15 mile hike around the lake starting at 8:30 AM. Bring lunch and water, hat and sun screen lotion. (Admission fee). Leader: John Behrmann (462-7058). (F,NS,3-3.5)
- SEP 11 (Sunday) CANAL, WHITE RIVER STATE PARK, DOWNTOWN - Assemble in the rear of All Saints Episcopal Church at 16th and Central Avenue for an 8 mile hike. Shorter options available. Hike to start at 1:00 PM. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791). (F,PS,2.5). 575-6718

- SEP 17 (Saturday) (A) KNOBSTONE TRAIL CLEAN-UP - You will enjoy the group effort as you do your part to improve the hiking trail. Meet at 10:00 AM at the Elk Creek Trailhead. Allow 2 hours travel. Go south on I-65 to SR 56 (Scottsburg exit). West on SR 56 for approximately 13 miles and turn left (south) at the trailhead sign. If you arrive at Georgetown, you have gone too far. Bring trail lunch and water. Wear heavy work clothes, rugged shoes and gloves. The DNR will furnish tools and supervisor. For information call Bill Flora (898-0760). You may want to bring some tools of your own, such as pruning shears. We encourage members to help out in the Club's annual maintenance on this long distance hiking trail
(B) SPRING MILL ROAD - Assemble in the parking lot of St. Luke's United Methodist Church, 100 W. 86th Street at 1:00 PM for an easy 6 to 7 mile hike. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791) (F,PS/NS,2.5). Bring water.
- SEP 18 (Sunday) MARY GRAY BIRD SANCTUARY - Allow 2 hours travel. Take SR 52 southeast to Rushville, then east on SR 44 about 11 miles to a sign for Mary Gray. Turn right on 525W and go south to a "T". Turn left and go a short distance to the first road to the right (450W). Turn right and go a couple of miles to the entrance to Mary Gray on the right. (WATCH CLOSELY AS YOU COME TO IT SUDDENLY AS THE ROAD CURVES TO THE LEFT). Meet at 10:30 AM for a 7 to 8 mile hike. (Shorter options available). Leader: Bill Larrison (359-7538). F,NS,2.5-3).
- SEP 20 (Tuesday) (A) BUTLER UNIVERSITY - See instructions for Sep 6 (A)
(B) ELLENBERGER PARK - See instructions for Sep 6 (B)
- SEP 24 (Saturday) (A) KNOBSTONE TRAIL (BACK COUNTRY LOOP) - Allow 2-1/2 hours travel. Take I-65 south to Seymour exit (US 50 west). Go west on US 50 through Brownstown. Take SR135 south about 9.1 miles and turn left just after the Muscatatuck River bridge. Follow Delaney Park signs. Go past Delaney park a short distance and turn left at the sign for Spurgeon Hollow. Meet near the lake at 10:00 AM. Moderate to rugged hikes of 12 miles or 17 miles. Bring lunch and water. Leaders: Don Holden (293-0547), and A.T. Mulberry (291-9979). (M,NS,3).
(B) RACCOON LAKE STATE RECREATION AREA - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take US 36 west to Raccoon Lake. (Fee). Meet in the first parking lot on the left. Hike of 5 to 6 miles to start at 1:00 PM. Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439). (M,NS,2.5-3).
- SEP 25 (Sunday) FOUR LAKES - ED CHAMBER'S MEMORIAL HIKE - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take SR 37 south to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at the Morgan-Monroe Forest sign and go about 4 miles to the entrance. Turn left into the entrance and then immediately right to the Bryant Creek Lake parking area. There will be two hikes, one of 6 miles and one of 8 miles (total 14 miles). If you are going on the long hike park at the Bryant Creek lot. If you are going on the morning hike only, drop off any passengers at Bryant Creek, then continue on the road 2.6 miles to the road to Beanblossom Lake. Turn right and go a mile to the lake parking lot on the right. Be there by 8:40 AM to be shuttled back to Bryant Creek area where the morning

hike will begin at 9:00 AM. Those who want to hike the AFTERNOON HIKE only should meet at the Beanblossom Lake parking by 12:00 noon. You will be shuttled back to your cars at the end of the hike. All hikers bring lunch and water for the lunch at Beanblossom Lake. Leaders: Peg & Heydon Franzen (812 988-2461) (H,NS,2.5).

OCT 1 (Saturday) FORT HARRISON VOLKSMARCH - Take SR 67 (Pendleton Pike) northeast to Post Road. Go north to the Army Finance Center, which is on the left just past the railroad tracks. Follow the directional signs for the Volksmarch. Meet the hike leader at 10:00 AM. After signing the roster, go to the start point table and register to receive "walk card". Have card validated at check points and turn it in after the hike. 10 kilometers (6.2 miles). Water will be provided at check points. Leader: Gerry O'Reilly (846-0657) (F,PS/NS)

OCT 2 (Saturday & Sunday) BACKPACK IN HOOSIER NATIONAL FOREST - Be sure to contact Libby Moore (852-4717) for reservations and information about this backpack. Take SR 37 south to Bloomington, then follow SR 46 east to SR 446. Turn right and go about 12 miles. About 1/2 mile past the Hardin Ridge sign you will come to the Tower Road on the left (just after the Maumee Boy Scout sign). Turn left and go a mile to the Horsemen Camp. Meet there at 11:00 AM on Saturday.

OCT 3 (Sunday) CATARACT FALLS FESTIVAL - Take I-70 west to the Cloverdale exit. Go south on US 231 for about 7 miles to the sign for the Cataract Falls State Recreation Area. Turn right and go about 3 miles to the entrance. Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Meet at 9:30 AM for easy to moderate hikes of 6 miles & 12 miles. We will eat lunch in the village of Cataract where a festival will be in progress. Entrees are HAM & BEANS, SLOPPY JOES, AND CONEYS. Leader: Jim Stern (844-3791) (M,NS/PS,3). Bring water.
