OCT 1 (Monday) CANAL HIKE - Meet at 5:45 PM in the parking lot of Broad Ripple Park located on Broad Ripple avenue for a 6 mile self-guided hike along the canal. To be repeated each Monday during October. (F,HS). Leader: Rick Kinnaman (861-3979).

OCT 2 (Tuesday) MORGAN-MONROE FOREST - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take SR 37 south to about 4 miles south of Martinsville. Turn left at Morgan-Monroe sign and go about 4 miles to the entrance. Turn left & drive about 5 miles to the fire tower parking lot for a moderate hike of about 5 miles. To be repeated each Tuesday in October. Hike to start at 9:30 AM. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Bill Flora (898-0760).

OCT 3 (Wednesday) (A) BROOKSIDE TO MONUMENT CIRCLE - Meet at the south entrance to the Brookside Park Community Center's main door at 7:15 AM for a self-guided hike to Monument Circle. Then meet again at 5:15 PM to walk back to the cars. This is an alternate transportation hike for those who work in the downtown area. This self-guided hike is 6 miles long. If non-workers wish to participate they may walk downtown and return at their leisure. (F,PS). This is a one time hike. Leader: Richard Vonnegut (637-8732).

(B) BROAD RIPPLE CANAL HIKE - Meet in the parking lot over the canal at 5:30 PM for self-guided hike 5 or 8 miles. To be repeated each Wednesday in October. (F,MS). Leader: Tom Patterson (849-9528).

OCT 6 (Saturday) COVINGTON TOWN & COUNTRY - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel from I-465 west side. Take I-74 west to Covington (exit 8), and turn right to Liberty Street. Turn left to

the Court House square and park. Meet at 9:30 AM for a 15 mile hike with an 8 mile option. Bring lunch & water. Hike includes a short courthouse mural tour. (M,NS&PS, 3). Leader: Cheryl Cavanaugh (291-8641).

- OCT 7 (Sunday) CATARACT FALLS FESTIVAL - Allow 1-1/4 hours travel from west side of Indpls. Take I-70 west to the Cloverdale exit. Go south on US 231 about 7 miles to the sign for Cataract Falls S.R.A. Turn right & go about 3 miles to the entrance. Meet at 9:30 AM for an easy to moderate hike of 6 or 12 miles. You can eat lunch in the Village where entrees include Ham & Beans, Sloppy Joes, and Coneys. Also enjoy the festival. (M,NS,3). Leader: Jim Stern (575-0718).

Turn left at the sign up the hill for Morgan-Monroe forest, and go a short distance to a shelter house. DO NOT DRIVE ALL THE WAY TO THE FOREST ENTRANCE. The shelter house is a very short distance from SR 37. Meet at 9:30 AM for a 12 or 18 mile hike. Bring lunch & water. (M,NS/PS, 3-3.5). Leader: Charles Hodges (787-3798).
- (B) MARIAN COLLEGE FALL COLORS - Meet at Major Taylor Velodrome gravel lot, 3649 Cold Springs Road at 9:30 AM for a 5 to 6 mile hike. (F,HS/PS, 3). Leaders: Don & Barbara Tipton (241-7953).
- OCT 14 (Sunday) FRANCIS SLOCUM, PART 2 - Allow 2 hours travel. Go north on SR 13. Approximately 3.5 miles north of Mier, turn right (east) on 500-N (to Jalapa). Go 5 miles through Jalapa, over the river and park on the right. 12 mile hike to start at 9:00 AM. Bring lunch & water. NOTE: "Mississinewa 1812" will be held Saturday and Sunday, October 13 & 14, 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM - a living history tribute to the life & times & events of early Indiana. (F,HS/PS,3). - (B) WHITEWATER STATE PARK - Allow 2-1/2 hours travel. Take US 52 east to Rushville, then SR 44 east to Liberty. Go south on SR 101 to the Park. Assemble in the beach parking area at 10:00 AM for an 8 to 9 mile hike. (M,NS,3). Leader: Barbara McNeely (1 392-2018).
- OCT 21 (Sunday) (A) RILEY TRAIL OF INDIANAPOLIS - Meet at the State House parking lot on the south side of Ohio Street at 8:00 AM for a 20 mile moderate hike, visiting historic landmarks. Bring lunch & water or purchase food along the way. (F,PS,3+). Leader: Tom Patterson (849-9528).
- (B) SHADES STATE PARK - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take I-74 west to Jamestown. Go through Jamestown & follow SR 234 west to the Park (fee). - OCT 28 (Sunday) (A) FIVE COVERED BRIDGES - Allow 1-1/2 hour travel. Meet at Hardees (junction of US 36 and US 41) in Rockville. Be on time for a car caravan to leave at 8:30 AM for the trailhead. Bring lunch & water for a 17 mile hike that visits 5 covered bridges in Parke County. Gravel & paved roads. (M,HS/PS,3.5). Leaders: Robert & Marjorie Begeman (359-4174).
(B) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at 2:00 PM at the amphitheater in Eagle Creek Park for a 5 to 6 mile hike. Follow signs along the main road. (Fee). (M,NS,2.5-3) Leaders: Mary & Win Pulsifer (784-1835).
- OCT 29 (Monday) CANAL HIKE - See instructions for October 1st.

- NOV 3 (Saturday) (A) GNAW BONE CAMP - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take SR 135 south to Nashville. Turn left and go about 6 miles to where SR 135 turns right (south). Go south about 2 miles to the Camp Entrance on the left. There will be a morning hike & an afternoon hike. Those taking both hikes should bring lunch & water. The morning hike will start at 10:00 AM for about 6 to 8 miles. The afternoon hike will start at 1:00 PM for about 5 to 6 miles. (M,NS,3). Leader: Bill Larrison(359-7538)
(B) JACKSON FOREST - KNOB LAKE TO STARVE HOLLOW AND RETURN - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel from south I-465. Take I-65 south to Seymour exit (US 50 West). Go west on US 50 to Brownstown. Take SR 250 left about 3 miles to the Jackson Forest entrance on the LEFT. Meet in the picnic parking area beyond the lake at 9:00 AM for a rugged 20 mile hike, with many steep hills. (NOTE: This is not the hike Bill Larrison leads from the area.) Bring lunch & water. (H,NS,3). Leader: Al Drehobl(898-3632)
- NOV 4 (Sunday) (A) NEBO RIDGE/BROWNING MOUNTAIN - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Meet at Van Buren Elementary ~~grade~~ school 6 miles south of Nashville on SR 135 (2 miles south of Gnow Bone Camp) at 1:00 PM for a rugged hike of 7 miles. Bring water. (M,NS,2-1/2). Leader: John Williams (812 988-0207).
(B) SWEET OWEN HIKE - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take SR 67 to Spencer. Go west on SR 46 (Morgan street) to Main Street. Turn south to 2nd block and park on the west side of the Court House. Meet at 11:00 AM for a 5 mile hike. Plan on eating at Chambers' buffet after the hike (or your own choice). (F,PS,3). Leaders: Don & Barbara Tipton (241-7953).
- NOV 5 (Monday) AUTUMN IN ZIONSVILLE - Meet at 6:00 PM in the parking lot south of the Friendly Tavern or north of the Bank on Main Street in Zionsville. (Take Zionsville Road north to parking area.) 5 mile self-guided hike to be repeated each Monday night in November. (F,PS). Leader: Shameron Mueller (271-8185).

Take I-74 east to I-275 east. Be careful not to go I-275 to Kentucky. Go north on I-71 to SR 123 and proceed south to SR 22 - 3. Turn right and go 4 blocks to Center Street. Turn right and park in the lot behind the depot at 9:00 AM for a car shuttle. We will hike 23 miles today and the remainder tomorrow. For overnight accommodations information contact the leader. A reservation for lodging must be made. Bring lunch and water. (F,HS/PS/3+). Leader: Tom Patterson (849-9528).
(B) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at the Amphitheater parking lot (follow signs on main road) at 10:00 AM for a 5 to 7 mile hike. (M,NS,2.5-3). Leaders, Mary and Win Pulsifer (784-1835).
- NOV 11 (Sunday) (A) LITTLE MIAMI SCENIC TRAIL - PART II - Allow 3 hours travel. Take I-74 east to I-275 east. Go north on I-71 to SR 73 and proceed west to SR 42. Turn right and go north to Roxanna-New Burlington St. Turn right and go 0.8 mile to a gravel road opposite the Terra Fertilizer Co. Turn right and park along the road for a car shuttle at 9:00 AM. (B) JOLIETVILLE - Allow 1 hour travel from downtown Indpls. Go north on SR 421 (Michigan Road) to SR 32. Turn east to Jolietville. Park along the highway (Not in Butch's Lot).
