- AUG 3 (Saturday) (A) DOWNTOWN POST OFFICE TOUR AND CANAL HIKE - Meet at 1:45 PM in the parking lot of the Downtown Post Office (Illinois & South Streets). Park at the west end of the lot. After a tour of the post office, there will be 2 to 3 mile downtown canal hike. There is no fee for the tour, but no children under 12 are allowed. (F,PS,2.5). Leaders: Alberta Neill (634-7672), and Ruth Overpeck (356-0135).
(B) OWEN-PUTNAM STATE FOREST - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take SR 67 south to the junction with US 231. Turn right (north) go 2.5 miles to Carp. Make U-turn left back south onto the county road. (Follow the Owen-Putnam Primitive camp signs). Go 0.5 miles and turn right and go 3.3 miles west to one mile beyond the stop sign in Cuba. Turn right and cross the wooden bridge. Go straight ahead (north) for 3 miles crossing 3 fords to the primitive campground. Meet at 11:30 AM for a moderate hike of 13 miles. Bring lunch & water. (M,NS,3). Leader: Marge & Bob Begeman(359-4174)
- AUG 4 (Sunday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at 2:00 PM at the Amphitheatre in Eagle Creek Park for a 5 to 7 mile hike. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439)
- AUG 5 (Monday) SPEEDWAY LEVEE HIKE - Meet at the Marsh Parking lot on Crawfordsville Road in Speedway at 8:30 AM for a 6 or 9 mile hike. To be repeated each Monday in September. (F,NS,2.5-3). Leader: Virginia Proctor (291-1678).
- AUG 6 (Tuesday) BEECH GROVE HIKE - Meet at Sarah Bolton Park in Beech Grove (take 13th St. south from Main St. to the Park), and meet just inside to the right of the entrance at 5:30 PM for a 4 or 8 mile self-guided hike. To be repeated each Tuesday in August. (F,PS/NS). Leaders: Marge and Bob Begeman (359-4174).
- AUG 7 (Wednesday) DOWNTOWN O'MALIA'S - Meet at 6:00 PM at the northeast corner of O'Malia's at 320 N. New Jersey for a 5 mile self-guided hike. To be repeated each Wednesday in August. (F,PS). Leader: Avis Shipman (247-9498).
- AUG 10 (Saturday) DEAM WILDERNESS - Allow 2-1/2 hours travel. Meet at 8:30 AM in the Fire Tower parking lot for a 12 to 15 mile hike. Go south on SR 37 to SR 46 east through Bloomington and turn right on SR 446. Cross Monroe Reservoir causeway and go about 4.3 miles. Turn left on Tower Ridge Road just after the Maumee Boy Scout sign, and go about 6 miles on the dirt road to the Fire Tower. Shorts are not recommended. Bring lunch & 2 liters of water. (H,NS,3). - AUG 11 (Sunday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at 2:00 PM at the Amphitheater in Eagle Creek Park for a 5 to 7 mile hike. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).

AUG 17 (Saturday) MARTIN STATE FOREST - Allow 2-1/4 hours travel. Take SR 37 south through Bedford and then west on US 50 17 miles to the forest entrance on the right. Veer right upon entering and park at the Tower Hill Shelter House for a 14 to 16 mile hike starting at 9:00 AM. Bring lunch & water. Class C camping facilities available for those wishing to stay over for Sunday's hike. (M,NS,3.5). Leader; Nanette Tate (577-1560 DAY) and (485-4619 EVENINGS).

AUG 18 (Sunday) (A) HINDOSTAN FALLS - Allow 2-1/2 hours travel. Take SR 37 south through Bedford then west on US 50 to Shoals. Turn left on Poplar immediately after crossing White River. Park in the Court House lot on right 1 to 2 blocks. There will be a shuttle at 9:00 AM (BE ON TIME). This 16 mile hike will trace a scenic 1800's stage coach route. Bring lunch & water. (M,PS,3). (B) RACCOON LAKE STATE RECREATION AREA - Allow 1-1/2 hours travel. Take US 36 west to the Raccoon Area SRA. Turn left on the first road past the gate house. Meet in the parking lot at 2:00 PM for a 7 to 8 mile hike. Bring water. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).

AUG 19 (Monday) SPEEDWAY LEVEE HIKE - See instructions for Aug 5th.

AUG 20 (Tuesday) (A) CROWN HILL CEMETERY - Enter through the gate on Clarendon Road just north of West 38th Street, and park on the driveway behind the Mausoleum, at 9:30 AM for an easy 5 mile hike (F,PS,2.5). Leader: Barbara Tipton (241-7953).

(B) BEECH GROVE HIKE - See instructions for Aug 6th.

AUG 21 (Wednesday) DOWNTOWN O'MALIA'S - See instructions for Aug 7th.

AUG 24 (Saturday) EARLY BIRD - EAGLE CREEK - Meet at 5:30 AM in the Eagle Creek parking lot on 56th Street just west of the causeway for an 11 to 12 mile hike around the lake. No short options. Bring snack & water. There will be a walk-in admission fee. (N,NS,3). Leader: A.T. Mulberry (291-9979).

AUG 25 (Sunday) CAMBRIDGE CITY/DUBLIN - Allow 1-1/4 hours travel. Take I-70 east to exit 131 (Wilbur Wright Road). Go south (right) to US 40 and turn left (east). Go to the Lakeview Restaurant 0.7 mile east of stoplight in Dublin. Park in the gravel section of the restaurant parking lot. Meet at 1:30 PM for a 6 or 8 mile hike. (F,PS,3). Leader: Hal Rynerson (1-987-7858).

AUG 26 (Monday) SPEEDWAY LEVEE HIKE - See instructions for Aug 5th.

AUG 31 (Saturday) HEMLOCK CLIFFS - Allow 3 hours travel. Meet at 10:00 AM for a 16 mile hike in a beautiful area with caverns and rock formations. Go south on SR 37 past Grantsburg to the Blue River (unmarked). The bridge is a low concrete bridge, 1/2 mile beyond Grantsburg. Turn right (west) on Union Chapel road (may not be marked), the first road one mile south of the Blue River bridge just before the end of the new portion of SR 37. (If you get to I-64, turn back). Go 2.6 miles on Union Chapel to a fork. Keep right on the gravel road for 3.4 miles to the 2nd "Y". Hemlock Cliffs sign should be posted there. Keep right on the small paved road to the parking lot (old picnic area). Bring lunch & water. (M,NS,3). Leaders: Marge & Bob Begeman

- SEP 1 (Sunday) (A) BROWN COUNTY STATE PARK - Allow 2 hours travel. Take SR 135 south thru Nashville to the park (fee). Meet at 1:00 PM in the parking lot at the Nature Center for a 7 to 9 mile hike. Bring water. (M,NS,2.5). Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).
(B) NORTH SALEM NO. 1 - Meet at 6:30 AM at the Eel River School in North Salem for a 20 mile self-guided hike. Go west on SR 36 to Danville, then right on US 39 to north to 236 then west (left) to North Salem. Turn right on SR 75 north to the school. Bring lunch & water. (F,PS). Leader: Dennis Taft (636-8829).
- SEP 2 (Monday) (A) NORTH SALEM NO. 2 - Meet at the Eel River School (same instructions as for Sunday) at 7:00 AM for a 17 mile self-guided hike. Bring lunch & water. (F,PS). Leader: Thomas Patterson (849-9528).
(B) HISTORIC FOUNTAIN SQUARE - Assemble in the parking lot beside the Garfield Park swimming pool at 2450 Shelby at 9:00 AM for an easy 5 to 6 mile hike. (F,PS,2.5). Leader: Estella Perkins (638-0697).
- SEP 3 (Tuesday) EAGLE CREEK PARK - Meet at the Amphitheater in Eagle Creek Park at 9:30 AM for a 5 to 6 mile hike. To be repeated each Tuesday during September. (M,NS,2.5) Leader: Mary Kidwell (852-2439).
- SEP 4 (Wednesday) CHAPEL HILL HIKE - Park at the Chapel Hill Shopping Center at Girl's School Road and west 10th Street in the Southwest corner of the lot. Meet at 6:00 PM for a 5 mile self-guided hike. (F,PS). Leader: Avis Shipman (247-9498)
- SEP 7 (Saturday) CHAIN O LAKES - Allow 3-1/4 hours travel. Take I-69 north to US 30 exit. Go west on US 30 to US 33 (about 1/4 mile). Turn right on US 33 west and go about 17 miles to SR 9. Turn right (north) to Park entrance (fee). Follow signs to beach parking area. 12 to 15 mile hike will start at 9:00 AM. Bring lunch & water. Camping facilities available for those wishing to stay overnight for Sunday's hike. (F,NS,3). Leader: Rick Kinnaman (861-3979).

- SEP 8 (Sunday) RIVERGREENWAY TRAIL - Meet at Johnny Appleseed Park at 8:00 AM for a hike of 25 miles, with options of 22, 17, 12, or 8 miles. Water & restrooms are along the route. This hike follows the banks of the St. Mary's and St. Joseph's rivers, and we will visit 7 city parks. Allow 3 hours travel. Take I-69 north to US 30 east exit. Follow US 30 east to the Coliseum. (B) FALL FLOWERS AT BROWN COUNTY PARK - Allow 2 hours travel. Take I-65 south to SR 46 exit at Columbus then west on SR 46 to the Park (fee). Meet at 9:30 AM at the Nature Center for a 10 mile hike with a 5 mile option. Bring lunch and water. (M,NS,2.5). Leaders: Barbara Tipton (241-7953). and Nanette Tate (485-4619).
- SEP 9 (Monday) BROAD RIPPLE/TOWPATH - Meet at 8:30 AM at the canal parking lot in Broad Ripple for a 5 or 8 mile hike. (To be repeated every Monday in September). (F,NS,2.5-3). Leader: Virginia Proctor (291-1678).

- SEP 12 (Thursday) GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND CLUB SOCIAL - ELECTION OF OFFICERS - (For members and their invited guests). Meet at 7:30 PM in the Social Hall of the Christ Presbyterian Church at 4900 East 38th Street (one block west of Emerson on north side). Park in rear and meeting room is down steps in east part of building. Main business of the evening is the election of officers. Assemble promptly at 8:30 AM for a 13 mile road hike including a slide show on his life, a visit to the home of his birth, "Westleigh the Cole Home", the old fashioned garden, as well as his grave in the Mt. - (B) MUNCIE, OLD WASHINGTON ST. HISTORICAL AREA, AND BALL STATE. - Allow 1-1/2 hour travel. Go north on I-69 to Exit 34, then east (right) on SR 32 (DO NOT GO ON SR 67). Go through Yorktown to Muncie. Go past the 2nd cemetery to the large Zayre sign. Turn left into the shopping area parking lot. Meet at 1:00 PM for an 8 mile hike. (F,NS/PS,3). - SEP 15 (Sunday) AVOCA FISH HATCHERY - Allow 1-3/4 hours travel. Go south on SR 37 to Avoca, about 20 miles south of Bloomington. Turn right (west) on SR 54 and SR 58. Assemble at the Visitor Center a short distance inside on the right at 10:00 AM for a 16 mile hike with shorter options of 6 or 11 miles. Those taking the longer hikes should bring lunch & water.
