- OCT 3 (Saturday) (A) BROOKVILLE TO METAMORA - Allow 1-1/2 hours. Take SR 52 (Brookville Rd). to Brookville, IN. Turn right at first stoplight in Brookville (6th St.), then left at Progress St. (Don't cross bridge). Park next to river in Municipal parking area. This is a 16 mile hike to start at 6:45 AM. Turn left toward West Lafayette and go a short distance (500 ft) and turn left on Burnette Rd. Go to the end of road (0.4 mile) and turn left onto 9th St. Drive 1.6 miles to Tippecanoe Battlefield parking lot. Meet at 9:00 AM for a 14 mile hike from Fort Quinate to Battleground. Be Prompt due to car shuttle. Bring lunch & water (F,PS,3). Leader: John Behrmann (462-7058)

Meet at the visitor center just inside on the right at 10:00 AM for hikes of 6, 11, and 15 miles. Bring lunch & water for longer hikes. (F,HS,3). Leader: Bill Larrison
- (B) LINCOLN TRAIL - Allow 4-1/2 hours travel. Take I-74 (359-753) west to I-57 and south to I-72 west into Springfield, IL. Take SR 125 north out of Springfield and turn right onto SR 97. Assemble in the first parking lot inside the entrance to New Salem Park at 8:00 AM for a 23 mile hike. Hikers can make at least part of the trip on Friday night. Camping is available at the Park and there are motels in Springfield. One suggestion for a book is "Abe Lincoln - Log Cabin to White House". The trail is oldest boy scout trail in America, established in 1926 and is route Lincoln reportedly used for his walks to Springfield. One recommended book is "Adversary in the House" by Irving Stone on the life of this pioneer, labor leader, and champion of social justice. Will visit his birth site, his home, and the cemetery.
